BE PREPARED

Housesitting with teenagers was a wonderful acceptable assignment for Janice and I to experience, to have, and how enjoyable it truly was! Being there over a weekend gave us even more hours to spend with our grandchildren. The question was raised: if we would

attend worship (go to church) on Sunday with them? Sunday morning found us up and going to a Church, one of the grandchildren attended regularly. We were greeted in the parking lot by others getting out of their cars.

We were welcomed at the door, by a greeter, who held the door for us to enter. We were also greeted and welcomed inside the door by at least

three others waiting for the sanctuary doors to open. Once inside we chose seats and had at least six different people come and welcomed us and talked with us in a friendly way. The service was different than some services we have attended but the Word was lifted up in music and in an excellent message by a young Pastor. The congregation numbered over a hundred and was a mix of all ages. I have reflected on that service since Sunday morning. I have asked myself if the congregations I have been attending and worshipping in have that friendliness and welcoming spirit, and seriously asking "Why Not?"

If you are reading this, I am asking you! If you even attend worship anymore, do YOU welcome others? Not just saying hi to your friends of 40 years, but moving yourself to go say hi, welcome the individual or individuals to the service and be friendly? Does the congregation have greeters, someone who hands out the bulletin, or individuals that make it their joyful opportunity to say, "Good Morning, glad you could be here this morning"? I watched worshippers who opened their Bibles, opened their phones to their downloaded Bibles or in this particular congregation looked up at the screen to read the scripture.

They were engaged with the service and the message being shared with them. I am sure there was someone, tired from the night before that fell asleep or at least closed their eyes for a moment. But I saw worshipers of all ages taking notes or sitting expectantly for the next point of the message.

Parishioners or Pastors - are you engaged in worship, or taking up space? What do you bring to the time of worship? I have heard individuals express: "I

didn't get anything from worship on Sunday, I didn't like the message or the music, or the children were noisy or the scripture was from the Old Testament and so on and so on." You get the drift of their noise! I want to ask you and them; what did you take to worship? What was your attitude, how did you approach the morning, how did you express your love for Jesus as you

arrived, entered into the sanctuary, and readied yourself to worship? Did you have your Bible, a pen to take notes or a heart ready to hear and share what God (Yes I mean God) was delivering to you! Where was your mind, your heart and your soul that morning at that moment? Were you even there or off somewhere thinking about; Yes, only God knows what!

Easter worship that brings that occasional visitor or the semi-annual member is right around the corner. Will you be ready to welcome, share with them and make them discover that Jesus indeed is alive and well in this congregation! Or will you go expecting to get something. It is not like an Egg Hunt, where you have to find the hidden treasure.

It is for you to come prepared, accepting, sharing and finding what God is offering! Do not miss this worship experience; who knows how many experiences' one will have before you/they are called to be ready to go! What will your next worship be like, are you prepared?



Sunday, April 16, 2023 at 5:00 pm at Camp Harmony

The Messiah in the Passover Banquet is a wonderful presentation that opens up the Old Testament and gives Christians new insights into communion. The Banquet will be approximately 2 and a half hours featuring a full Jewish Seder meal and explanations of the traditions presented. The presenter is **Jeff Kipp** from Chosen People Ministries.

Jeff was born Brooklyn, New York. In the Fall of 1973, Jeff left college, friends, and everything behind to find America and find himself. He landed in a little New Mexican town called Taos and the second day there, he was led to a Jesus People coffee house and met Dr. Michael Silverburg, a fellow Jew and fellow New Yorker. That night was the first time Jeff was told

that Jesus was the Jewish Messiah and he prayed to

receive Him into his heart and life. The Lord began to speak to Jeff of his destiny and the call of God upon his life in regards to reaching his Jewish people with the gospel. It was also in Northern California that he met his wife-to-be, Kathy. The Lord had led her to Santa Cruz to be a part of Youth with a Mission. They were called by the Lord to move back to Kathy's hometown of Minneapolis to begin their new life together. It was there they were introduced to the Messianic Movement and became part of a Messianic Jewish Congregation.



After many years of ministry, the Lord called the Kipps to relocate to Pittsburgh in 1993 where they have successfully pioneered and planted two Messianic Congregations and have seen many Jewish people come to faith in their Messiah. They lead Congregation Yeshua Ben David, started in 2005 and meet in the heart of Pittsburgh's Jewish community, in Squirrel Hill.

This event is open to people of all ages and families are encouraged to attend and be part of this experience.


