#### **WE ARE CHOSEN**

> that have had the name of some one that we have helped, the name of a banquet that we have done when we served as Jesus would serve. Think about it what have you and your congregation been doing to bear fruit? I think that when we put the basket in a place were we will see it quite often we will be amazed at what we have done in Jesus name. I also think that the sight of that basket of fruit will inspire us to seek out others ways that we can serve as chosen people. And this year at district conference we will bring out baskets of fruit and be amazed or maybe astounded at just what Jesus is doing in the Western Pennsylvanian District of the Church of the Brethren.



A final thought if you listen to Christian radio maybe you have heard this song, Crazy about you, sung by Tauren Wells. This song just might be getting to the point. If you listen to the lyrics carefully you just might hear this line, "You are the one He chose..." Look it up on the internet. Sing along with the video. Its ok no one is listening. Learn the song for I'm really hoping to sing it as District Conference as a people that indeed have been chosen by Christ!



#### SOME GOOD NEWS!!

#### FROM THE GREENSBURG COB

First of all, I want to thank God for all that He has done for us and we would never be able to do all we do without Him leading the way. When I started as full-time Pastor at Greensburg, the first thing God told me is outreach. We started a group called Disciples' Hands in 2020.

We started a feeding the hungry program where we provided food boxes and emergency food to people in need in our area. Our feeding the hungry program grew to a new level when a school contacted us in 2022 and asked if we could provide weekend meals for 150 students that are in need, of course even without thinking about it we said yes we could do that. The cost for feeding 150 students for 4 weeks total near \$1300.00 so in one school year it cost us roughly \$11,700.00. We buy a month's worth of food which consists of microwavable items, cereal, oatmeal, soup and snacks. We buy most of the food at Sam's Club and we set up a packing party and pack all 600 bags for a month.

Our Eagle Scout Hunter Muir completed a project and built a blessing box that was placed in front of the church. We fill it up with canned goods and other items, so people can drive up and get something to take home.

We also started a program called Joyful Celebration. In September of 2021. It is a program for those with mental disabilities. It is every Monday at 5pm and we provided a meal, music (they love to sing) prayer time, a short message and a craft. We tell everyone if you want to see Love just come to our Monday night program because it is fun for all and just to see the smile on their faces is amazing.

All the above outreach activities is completely funded by Disciples' Hands Group. Not one penny comes from the church. Don't take that wrong the church would help if needed but God has provided in many ways, plus He puts us to work too.

We get our funding by:

- Homemade Soup Sales—several kinds for soup are sold along with homemade bread, other baked Goods and hot sausage sandwiches.
- Spaghetti Dinners by our own Chef Lena
- Donations

We also have Operation Christmas Child Shoebox from Samaritans Purse. Shirley Baker is the coordinator and does a fantastic job of keeping everything in order. Just because this is a Christmas Program it is an all year-round project.

Disciples' Hands is a truly amazing group of people that will do whatever it takes to get it done. We all work together very well.


