EASTER GREETINGS

On Sunday April 17th Christians will be celebrating Easter, the day on which the resurrection of Jesus is said to have taken place. The date of celebration changes from year to year. We celebrate Easter on the first Sunday after the first full moon following the spring equinox.

In A.D. 325, the Emperor Constantine, who favored Christianity, convened a meeting of Christian leaders to resolve important disputes at the Council of Nicaea. The most fateful of its decisions was about the status of Christ, whom the council recognized as "fully human and fully divine." This council also resolved that Easter

should be fixed on a Sunday, not on day 14 of Nisan. As a result, Easter is now celebrated on the first Sunday after the first full moon of the vernal equinox, April 17, 2022.

Brent Landau, lecturer in religious studies, at the University of Texas at Austin, writes: "It is important to point out that while the name "Easter" is used in the English-speaking world, many more cultures refer to it by terms best translated as "Passover" (for instance, "Pascha" in Greek) — a reference, indeed, to the Jewish festival of Passover.

In the Hebrew Bible, Passover is a festival that commemorates the liberation of the Jewish people from slavery in Egypt, as narrated in the Book of Exodus. It was and continues to be the most important Jewish seasonal festival, celebrated on the first full moon after the vernal equinox.

At the time of Jesus, Passover had special significance, as the Jewish people were again under the dominance of foreign powers (namely, the Romans).

Jewish pilgrims streamed into Jerusalem every year in the hope that God's chosen people (as they believed themselves to be) would soon be liberated once more."

"Soon be liberated once more', that is what everyone should seek to gain during this season of Lent/Easter. Liberated from strife, anxiety and most of all from sin. Our congregational leaders, Pastors and mature followers of Christ should be offering ways to worship

and dwell in the peace of Christ. Prayer and Bible reading needs to be the spiritual food we feed on and use for growth. Now is the time to recognize the risen Christ and accept Him. Put away childish, petty differences and focus on Jesus. The time moves closer to the return of Jesus; how will He find you serving Him and one another in His name?



As I address you in this article, please allow me to share where your District Leadership is at this time. We have a **Search Committee** working to gather information from our congregation's members in the form of a survey. Did you complete your survey and turn it in? We continue to receive profiles for the interim position and soon will share the parameters for a permanent position of District Minister. For now Dr. Ron Beachley, Moderator-Elect, Pastor Rob Rummel, Moderator, and me, Pastor Pete Kaltenbaugh, District Board Chair, will share the different responsibilities of District Minister and keep things moving and together. If you have a request for the District please call the District office. We will make an effort to answer your requests. During this time, allows us to work together faithfully and cooperatively for Jesus. Continue to pray and seek guidance of the Holy Spirit. Continue to walk together towards the future. Jesus loves each and every one of us.

The shoe project team would like to thank everyone who has collected and delivered shoes for the current project. Together, we have been able to make a difference for the orphanage in the past few years by simply collecting gently worn shoes!

The current shipment to funds2orgs will occur sometime during April, scheduled according to their truck availability. Anyone who has additional shoes for donation, please contact any member of the committee to have them included in the shipment. Remember, every pair of shoes beyond the minimum number adds to the profits for the orphanage!

We are so grateful to the ICA for hosting our project at their Jerome building for the past few years, however, that building will no longer be available in the future. Unless we locate another suitable sorting and storage facility, we will not be able to continue with shoe project.

In order to operate, the project requires a large open area (approximately 300 square feet or more) for sorting and storing shoes; a convenient location for shoe drop offs and shipping; and hopefully, access without/few stairs. Heat is not a necessity, free access for the committee members is helpful.



ADVANCE RESERVATIONS

The table decorators (hosts) are responsible to sell seats and collect the money for those at your table. All seats should be purchased with pre-sale reservations as we are expecting a sale-out crowd. (Please see attached reservation sheet.) We will not use tickets, but check the paid reservations at the door for a will call. The cost is \$35 per person. A portion of this cost is considered a donation and is tax-deductible. A receipt will be available for the donation portion on the night of the event for those needing them. Additional donations are WELCOME!!!!!

BASKET FOR SILENT AUCTION

In order to raise as much money as possible for the children of Hogar Enmanual, we encourage each table-decorating team to also provide a basket to be used in a silent auction to help offset the costs of the night. This doesn't have to be your expense ---- Solicit local businesses to donate things for your basket! If you have enough donated gifts to create more than one basket, we certainly won't turn anything down. The baskets do not need to be based on any specific theme.

TABLE DECORATING

SET UP: Faith Hall will be open on Friday, April 8th from 10 am to 8 pm. and on Saturday, April 9th from 10 am to 4:00 pm

The tables will be marked indicating which are yours to decorate. All tables should have their final decorating done before 4:00 pm on Saturday so that pictures can be taken of the tables.

• There will be an 8-foot rectangular table for each eight guests (\$280). Two pushed together for 16 (\$560), or three for 24 (840). It is okay if your table isn't 100% full, but please try to sell all your seats.

NEEDED FOR EACH TABLE:

- TABLE COVERING
- NAPKINS -- for each place setting. No paper plates. Plates provided will be used to serve the food.
- DECORATIONS: Decorate the center of the table, leaving space for the plates of food to be served.
 - If your decorations might obstruct other's view of the stage, your table will be in the back or side of the hall.
 - Please make sure any sand or glitter that is used is contained for easy clean-up.
 - If using candles, please use flameless, battery-operated ones. No electricity is provided at the tables.
 - Boxes used to transport your decorations can be stored in the other dining hall until after the event
- FAVOR -- for each place setting (this can be something other than a dessert as desserts will be provided.)
- SERVERS -- Two people that can help serve the dinner plates prepared by Camp Staff while the food is still piping hot to those sitting at your table.
- <u>Plates, silverware, drinking glasses, and coffee cups are provided</u> and will be available in the hall for you to pick up and put at each of your place settings when you decorate your table.

CLEAN UP

• Each team is asked to help provide clean-up. All decorations must be removed; chairs and tables taken down at the end of the program.

PRAY FOR UKRAINE

Mission and Ministry Board issues statement on Ukraine, calls for time of concerted prayer and action for peacebuilding

The Church of the Brethren Mission and Ministry Board issued a statement on Ukraine during its Spring meeting at the denomination's General Offices in Elgin, Ill. Board chair Carl Fike, who led the meeting, signed the statement with the unanimous consent of the members of the board.

Also participating in the meeting, which was held in person and online, were the ex officio members of the board including general secretary David A. Steele, the Annual Conference officers, executives of the Annual Conference agencies, and a representative of the Council of District Executives.

Brethren Disaster Ministries distributes first round of grant money for Ukraine crisis

The Russian invasion of Ukraine has caused a massive displacement of people both inside Ukraine and across the borders into neighboring countries. As of March 11, the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) estimates that more than 1.85 million are displaced within the country, with an additional 12.65 million directly affected by the conflict. It reports that more than 2.5 million refugees have crossed Ukraine's land borders. That number is increasing daily with an estimate that up to 4 million will eventually flee the country.

Responding to this crisis will be a massive, multi-year effort. Brethren Disaster Ministries is working with partners to determine the best avenues of support, including immediate assistance as well as a longer-term response.

An initial Emergency Disaster Fund (EDF) grant of \$10,000 has been given to CORUS International—an organization that includes long-time partners IMA World Health and Lutheran World Relief—to provide assistance to refugees and send assistance to Ukraine through partners already on the ground. Additional partners are likely to include organizations such as Church World Service, ACT Alliance, and European Baptist relief agencies. Thank you for caring and supporting this effort!





PLEASE FOLLOW THESE INSTRUCTIONS FOR YOUR QUILT BLOCK

TYPE OF FABRIC

- Pre-shrunk cotton or cotton blend.
- If you use stabilizer, Please use only water soluble, very soft or easily removed backing.

Do not use: double knit, counted cross-stitch on canvas, liquid embroidery, padded blocks, or heat-applied designs or photos.

PLEASE: NO GLUE

PATTERN

- Use your own creativity to make your design.
- Important: Identify your block with your congregation's name, state, and/or district.
 This makes the quilts more valuable!
 (Second blocks from your congregation need not be identified.)





SIZE OF BLOCK

- <u>Outside border:</u> Not less than 8½ square AFTER it is worked.
- <u>Inside design:</u> Not more than 8" square with nothing in the seam allowance.

Cut the block to size AFTER it has been pieced, embroidered, or appliquéd.

Accuracy is important.

Blocks less than 8½ inches will not fit; larger designs will be obscured.

We plan to be at Omaha for conference this year, but in the event of COVID restrictions, we will still do wall hangings to be quilted at a later date. So please, send those blocks!!
