#### DISTRICT MODERATOR'S MESSAGE

I begin with a question asked in the article I wrote in the February Highlights; "What will or can give us a spirit of 'unity among ourselves, and our faith communities, as we follow Christ Jesus?" How did you answer that question then and how do you answer if you are reading this in the Highlights? Are we as faith communities and sisters and brothers in Christ "Bound Together By Prayer?" Then my question becomes, how is that lived out in our daily lives? I believe within the Western PA

District we are bound together in our commitment to serve the Lord and share the good news of Jesus love with others. This does not automatically bring unity but it is a beginning and a start as we seek to serve the Lord in our daily lives. It begins with a positive attitude and a strong relationship with the Lord. That relationship grows and is strengthen by our pray-

er life, our study of scripture, and our involvement in the faith community. We are to seek unity, "WHY," so that with one heart and mouth you may glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. Unity within our individual lives and in the faith community allows us to glorify God. Is that not what you and I should be about in our faith journey? Unity or harmony in the faith community is like we are singing a song, No matter if we are singing in harmony or not, we are making a joyful sound to the Lord.

If as an individual we are not in unity with the Lord, how can we glorify God our heavenly Father?" Also, as a faith community if we are not in unity as sisters and brothers how can we glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ? My prayer and desire as a disciple of Christ is that we seek to be in harmony with our brothers and sisters in the Western PA District.

I'm writing this article a few days before we leave for Annual Conference (AC). My prayer is that unity can be achieved as delegates and others in attendance seek God's will and direction for our denomination. I have prayed and continue to pray for the Holy Spirit to challenge and encourage each of us, as decisions are

> made at AC, that we are listening too and seeking unity with the Lord and our brothers and sisters in Christ. Unity will not be achieved if we sit on our hands and hope others will see issues and concerns just like I do. No, unity will happen when we pray together, dialogue with others, and seek God's will together Unity is not something easily achieved.

Who would know that better than most; Paul, one who faced numerous challenges throughout his ministry? He could write and challenge us with the verses written in Romans 15:5, "May the God who gives endurance and encouragement give you a spirit of unity among yourselves as you follow Christ Jesus." Unity happens when we pray, seek God's will, and work together to bring glory to God our heavenly Father.

Again, I want to encourage us as individuals, and faith communities to be praying for District Conference. Praying that unity will be something we can achieve and together "with one heart and mouth," bring glory to God. Harmony can be achieved when we work for it to happen and trust the Holy Spirit to guide the process. My prayer is that we as a district and individual will be "Bound Together By Prayer," as we meet in October for District Conference. Please join me as we pray for unity that we might be faithful witnesses for the Lord in our daily lives.

This joyful program will begin at 7:00 pm. Please invite your friends and family to experience this beautiful, inspirational service. A free-will offering will be lifted.




