“In the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who will judge the living and the dead, and in view of his appearing and his kingdom, I give you this charge: Preach the word; be prepared in season and out of season; correct, rebuke and encourage – with great patience and careful instruction.” II Tim. 4: 1 & 2





Seventy-five years ago, Dan West began outlining a simple but groundbreaking plan to help the hungry. West, a Midwestern farmer and Church of the Brethren member, had recently returned from volunteer service in the Spanish Civil War where his job was to provide weary refugees with a single cup of milk. He knew American farmers had resources many others did not: cows and the steady supply of nutrition from their milk.

This "not a cup, but a cow" thought was the driving force behind West founding Heifer International.

Now, 75 years later, the "teach a man to fish" philosophy still inspires our work to end world hunger and poverty once and for all and has transformed the lives of millions.

A Christian Home for homeless, abused, and severely neglected children

2018 ANNUAL REPORT

Some things are worth repeating..... and every once in awhile we believe it is good to reiterate just what and who El Hogar de Niños Enmanuel is.

El Hogar de Niños Enmanuel is a nonprofit institution that has been in operation since 1974 in response to the needs of homeless children caused by the hurricane FIFI.

Hogar Emanuel is maintained solely by donations of funds and goods. The child sponsorship program that is run through the Western Pennsylvania District Church of the Brethren's Mission Program contributed \$188,000, 45% of the Home's income in 2018, and remains the backbone to its operating budget. In addition work teams travel to the Home each year to complete various projects on site. The home has been blessed with on-site volunteers from the Brethren Volunteer Service and Mennonite Central Committee programs as well as the constant flow of other numerous corporate and individual volunteers.

Each child received here is given opportunities to receive an academic education as well as vocational training, life skills, and most importantly, guidance, discipline, love and a Christian upbringing. The Home maintains an average population of eighty children.

Hogar Enmanuel falls under the direction of the Honduran government's child ser-

vices agency (DINAF), that looks to existing non-governmental, privately-run Christian homes such as ours for help in caring for at risk children. To date, we are provided very little financial support from the government. Therefore, sadly, we are limited as to how many children we are able to provide comprehensive protection by the amount of donations received.

As you can expect, the children in our care face some major medical conditions and nearly all need psychological therapy. However, regardless of the fact that this kind of care is not free, donations seem to arrive just when we need them! Praise God!

Hogar Enmanuel remains a giving partner with the TOMS SHOE One-for-One giving program™ The older youth at the Home along with the help of volunteer work teams have been responsible for **distributing 78,453 pairs of TOMS** this past year alone. The program is still going strong.

Individual fund raising events both in the States and in Honduras raise money for special projects. Last year, the TOYLAND event in Pennsylvania brought in over \$13,000 towards the renovation and expansion of the nursery and boy's dormitories.

Other programs for the children at el Hogar include a chicken farm where they produce their own eggs as

well as poultry for consumption. They also grow some of their own vegetables, bananas, and other fruits. The kids also make their own tortillas (a main staple food). These ventures not only help to make the home self-sufficient, but are used as a method to teach business skills.

Soccer (of course) is their number ONE activity. They also have a band/chorus music program, dance classes, swimming lessons, and educational field trips to name a few.

Hogar Enmanuel has its own on-site kindergarten school. Jardin de Enmanuel, also offers classes to the children of the poor neighboring community. It has had an average **yearly enrollment of 43.** The older children attend various schools throughout the city and we are proud that several have gone on to university.

We do everything possible to lower costs – such as eating from our gardens, the installation of solar panels, and obtaining donations of in-kind supplies. Our greatest need is meeting those expenses for which we must pay cash. In 2018, salaries made up approximately 45% of our annual spending. Educational expenses took up about 6%, and the remaining 49% of the \$379,341 was used for all other operational expenses such as food, clothing, medical, vehicles, etc. **That translates to a**

cost of about \$4741 per child per year. However, despite the problems and many issues facing Honduras, this Home continues to move forward and is making an enormous positive impact for many.

In summary, you can see that our work here is far from done, but because of **YOU**, our faithful supporters, much progress is taking place to care for the homeless, severely disadvantaged, and abused children of this third world country. Thank you and may God bless you.



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


