ATTENTION: CHURCH BOARD MEMBERS!!!

I want to pass on to you a piece of news that demands your attention! I received this information from a subscription to Church Safety newsletter:

"Churches and daycare centers that use drop-side cribs are being encouraged to replace them by December 2012, when new federal safety standards take effect. Detaching rails have been associated with at least 32 suffocation and strangulation deaths since 2000. Faulty or defective hardware have led to other deaths and injuries, prompting the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) to pass stricter mandatory standards for cribs. After June 28, 2011, all baby cribs manufactured, sold, or resold in the U.S. must have fixed sides, sturdier slats, and stronger hardware and supports."

Now, as I understand it, church nurseries that only have volunteer staff during worship services are not *required* to comply. HOWEVER ... should a tragedy occur because of an outdated, noncompliant crib, the church AND its administrative board would be open to liability. That could sound like "wrongful death suit" or "child endangerment" or "criminal negligence." Not to mention bearing the weight of a little one's tragic injury or death. So please, take the time, consider the options, and spend the money.

AbbsTract December 2011/January 2012

So for a lot of people, it's getting to be "new year's resolution" time. I gave up on those a long time ago. Can I get a witness? ⁽²⁾ But there's something to be said for starting a new year with a fresh approach – whether in your family life, your career or maybe within your own spirit. As carrot-haired Anne Shirley once remarked, "...tomorrow is a new day, with no mistakes in it yet." That's how a new year feels at the start – new, unsullied.

So I got to thinking about these "resolutions" that people make. And really, most of them are rooted in overcoming some fear. Think about it – if I resolve to get into shape, I'm really saying that I want to overcome my fear of exercise. If I resolve to eat healthier, I'm really saying that I want to master my fear of avoiding fatty (delicious!) foods, or on the flip-side, my fear of eating vegetables. If I resolve to give more money to my church, or to Camp Harmony or to the Brethren Home (or any other worthy cause), then I pledge to turn over my fear of not having enough – in short, I embrace faith-giving over poverty-fearing.

What fears do you need to address in your life? What terror has your Enemy used to subjugate you and keep you captive? From what fears does Jesus long to set you free?

Freedom from fear ... isn't that the sweet, fragrant message of Christmas? "Because of God's tender mercy, the morning light from heaven is about to break upon us, to give light to those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death, and to guide us to the path of peace." (Zechariah in Luke 1:78-79)

I want to look at five fears that will surely destroy us. If you suffer under any of these fears, I invite you to have a conversation with the Curse-Breaker about it. Talk with the One who brought light and freedom for us in the gift of Jesus. The One who promises to renew our minds and to give strength to our feeble limbs. He gives us each tomorrow – full of promise and devoid of mistakes.

- Ephebiphobia: the fear of teenagers. Admit it most of us have a touch of this one. Ask God to help you to see youth in a new way – not as unruly rebels or ignorant nuisances, but as people who need love, too – just like you. Start actively encouraging today!
- <u>Geliophobia</u>: the fear of laughter. Some of us are afraid to enjoy a good belly laugh it might be improper. But hearty laughter must have been a hallmark of Jesus' life! Think about it – He traveled the countryside with a rough 'n' rowdy crowd – I bet the paycheck that Jesus laughed at a fart joke or two in His time. He was perfect, but He was no stick-in-the-mud! Ask Him to help you laugh more.
- 3. <u>Sophophobia</u>: the fear of learning. This one is especially dangerous! When was the last time you learned a new craft, hobby, poem, or recipe? Do you embrace a lifelong desire to learn, or have you become shriveled in your thinking? Have you approached the Scriptures with *wonder* lately? What new things have you learned about God? Ask Him to help you be a better student.
- 4. <u>Neophobia</u>: the fear of new things. This one cracks me up. I hear people in the church griping all the time about new things, new ideas, new people, new processes. But people really DO like new things! These same people are ecstatic with a new car. And overjoyed with a new grandchild. And boy, do they like a new restaurant to appear in town! Ask God to chip away your fear of the new and go for it!
- 5. <u>Euphobia</u>: This one baffles me, but it's rampant among Christians. Euphobia is the fear of good news. Christmas is all about good news. The Good News of Jesus Christ! So why are we so reluctant to tell others??? Haven't figured that one out, yet. Let's ask God together to give us all a radical love of His VERY Good News!

His love can conquer every fear; ask His help in this New Year! Merry Christmas and a Blessed 2012!

Puerto Rico Mission Trip Wrap-Up

A year has almost past since our last trip to Puerto Rico. What a blessing it has been to serve there for the past several years. We were all so excited to see the work that needed done at Maribel's house. Pastor Juan warned us that the conditions were very bad and that we would need to wear proper shoes and clothing while working. This meant no sandals or shorts. As we walked up the path, piled five feet high with garbage, we soon realized the conditions were worse than we had expected. We continued walking through a dilapidated house arriving at what was to become Maribel's house. All we saw was an 18x18 shell, no doors or windows and some rotting wood siding. More garbage was piled at least waist high around the side and back. Everyone in our group was very guiet. I can just imagine what may have been running through the minds of the group. Whatever negative thoughts there may have been, about working in garbage that smelled, along with the chicken coops, dogs, and a broken drainage pipe, didn't interfere, didn't consume us, and didn't win. God's plan prevailed. Praise Him!

The first three days were spent in an assembly line hauling garbage out and hauling buckets of shale in. We could have been down hearted and complained about our work, but that's not at all what happened. While we were working, we were singing praises to God. People came out on their porches and looked though their windows. Maria, a dear and sweet lady, worked alongside us every day. I'll never forget how she laughed when we sang, "He's got the *loco* Americana in His hands." *Loco* means crazy in Spanish. Us crazy? Maybe the people thought we were, but I think it was all part of God's plan.

Maria is in her fifties and she is a widow. Pastor Juan told us she took the death of her husband very hard and became withdrawn. She came every day and worked hard side by side with us. I truly believe God arranges for people to meet. He created the world so intricately, not by chance. Neither are life's relationships. Maria worked so hard on Maribel's house wanting and expecting nothing in return. Now a year later our group is going to work on Maria's house. This was very exciting news to all who went on the trip last year. God, not only is meeting her physical needs, but also filling her needs to learn. You see, Maria is illiterate. Maribel has been teaching her how to read. God's word says "My God will meet all your needs... "-Philippians 4:19 NIV. He doesn't just meet some of our needs, He promises to meet them all. It really touches my heart to see God restoring the lives of these two women in Puerto Rico and to hear how they are helping each other.

You can be involved in helping to meet Maria's needs too. "*It is more blessed to give than to receive.*" Acts 20:35. We all have been so blessed by the work in Puerto Rico. Relationships are being built along with the houses. Physical as well as spiritual needs are being met. 

What's happening at the Emanuel Children's Home?

A Day in the Life of Our Kids



The children's day at Hogar Emanuel isn't all play and no work. It starts bright and early-waking up around 4 am. They are showered, dressed, have eaten breakfast, and are out the door leaving for school by 6:15 am. School ends

at noon and they are on their way back home in time for lunch. After lunch, they begin their chores. The children of all ages are responsible for keeping their home clean. All the children, except for the very youngest ones, do their own laundry on a wash board. They take turns in the kitchen and dining hall helping with dishes and food preparation. Some are responsible for keeping the yard raked, some tend to the garden and others the chickens. Homework time is from 1:30 to 3:00 pm, when the kids break up into groups by grade with the help of one of the educators to get their homework done. After homework, they complete any unfinished chores. Hopefully they will have some free time before their 5 pm dinner. The children also participate in extra-curricular activities such as futbol (soccer), swimming, music classes, and karate. So you can see, they have a busy day. Bedtime comes quickly. The little kids are tucked in by 7:30 and the older kids around 8:30 pm for a good night's sleep. Then begins another day.

This month's STAR employee is Doctor ADRIANA. She began in September 2008 to carefully evaluate



and keep on top of the health status of our children. She not only dispenses each daily dose of vitamins but administers necessary medications for those who are ill. She collaborates with local clinics, medical brigades, and hospitals

for all medical and psychiatric care including vaccination campaigns and dental care. For example, this month she will help coordinate a pediatric, dental, orthopedic, gynecologic, and surgical Brigadier for all the children who need it, along with general blood typing of the children. She thankfully reports that other than some mild health concerns this past year, only two of the children will be facing surgery. One for an inguinal hernia and the other for a congenital bone problem in his leg.

She has one son of her own and loves the children at Hogar Emanuel. She enjoys making people laugh and is claimed to be guite the comedian around Hogar Emanuel. Please pray for Adriana as she cares well for the health of our children.
