Isn't a fresh start wonderful? At the dawn of a new year, it feels like we get a new beginning in life. I know it's just how the calendar works, but somehow a new year brings with it the promise of a chance to do things better. When I think of fresh starts in the Bible, I have to think of Peter.

Oh, Peter. Dear Peter. Always the first to speak. Always the first to apologize for what he said. Sometimes I read about Peter and laugh, and other times he makes me cry, because I see my own faults in him.

In Mark 14 we see Jesus telling the group that Peter would deny knowing Him on the night of His arrest, and we are told that Peter kept insisting, "I will NEVER!" What a fool. Peter *in that very moment* tries to deny what Jesus is saying. Well, you know how the story goes. The group is camped out on the Mount of Olives, Jesus is engaged in arduous prayer, His friends are dozing off. The soldiers come with the Jewish authorities, Judas delivers with a kiss, Peter reacts with a sword, and Jesus is taken into custody. All four Gospels record what happens next.

Peter is standing in the courtyard of the High Priest, and the doorkeeper asks him if he's one of Jesus' followers. He denies it. Then some people standing around ask him the same thing. And he denies it. Then one of the guys who was actually there at Jesus' arrest insists that he saw Peter there with Jesus. And Peter denies it a third time. The rooster crows, the realization sinks in, Peter runs away and weeps bitterly.

We've all been there. That thing you swore you'd NEVER do is the very thing you've just done. That thing you promised not to do again has reappeared in your life. And that sinking, creeping, heavy, sickly feeling comes over you. The guilt, the shame, the regret. The cold fear.

What. Have. I. Done.

If I know Peter like I think I do, he spent the next few days beating himself up. Asking himself, "How could I have done it?" Wishing he could change the fact that the last thing he did for his best friend and Lord before His crucifixion was to deny ever knowing Him.

Boy, the enemy of our souls sure likes to kick us when we're down. I'm betting Satan was working overtime to poison Peter's heart and mind in those days. If he could convince Peter that his service to God was over, there would be one less believer to carry the Good News to the waiting world. The enemy loves to convince us of our failure, strip us of our value, remind us of our sins. But that wasn't the end of the story for Peter.

In John 21 we get to watch a scene so utterly perfect that it makes me chuckle. It's just such a great picture of who Jesus is. This is after the resurrection, after Jesus has appeared to a bunch of people. The disciples have just met the risen Jesus on the beach for breakfast. After they've eaten, Jesus and Peter have a chat.

"Peter, do you love Me?" "Yes, Lord, I do."
 "Feed My lambs." Again. "Peter, do you love Me?"
 "You know I do." "Shepherd My sheep."
 Again. "Peter, do you love Me?" There it was. The third time. Peter was grieved. It cut him to the heart. "Lord, You know all things. You know I love You." "So, feed My sheep."

Three denials. Three affirmations. An opportunity for repentance to cover each failure. What grace! Peter in the courtyard was a pathetic coward. Peter on the beach was forgiven and empowered for service! Jesus set Peter on a trajectory that pointed directly toward Pentecost when his bold preaching would bring 3,000 people to salvation and set the world ablaze.

Do you need a fresh start today? Does your church need a fresh start this year? Are you hiding somewhere between the courtyard and Pentecost, wondering if God can still use you? He can and He will. Come before Him humbly and repent. Seek His face and He will give you His grace. Worship Him and wonder at His Word. How God longs for us to embrace a fresh start! Amen, may it happen here.



Global Mission Updates

Global Mission Prayer Guide



Haiti

Pray for Church of the Brethren volunteers with the [Global Food Initiative](#) (GFI) and agricultural staff of Eglise des Freres d'Haiti (Church of the Brethren in Haiti) as they install a new aquaponics system at the Brethren Guesthouse and Ministry Center in Croix-des-Bouquets. An aquaponics system grows fish and plants, such as vegetables, together in water. The fish waste provides fertilizer for the plants, and the plants naturally filter the water for the fish. This system will serve as a teaching and learning model that eventually will be replicated in other locations if successful. Pray that this project can lead to greater food production and self-sustainability for Haitian communities.

Pakistan

Pray for the victims of a church bombing in the city of Quetta, where 9 people were killed and at least 50 injured. Pakistan's Islamic State group affiliate has claimed responsibility for the suicide bombing. Pray for strength and healing for the wounded. Pray for miraculous comfort for those who have lost loved ones.

Venezuela

Pray for all those affected by the severe economic crisis in Venezuela. Hyperinflation and food shortages have led to a massive hunger crisis. Infants and children have been especially victimized, with hundreds dying from severe malnutrition. Overrun hospitals have lacked the space and resources to treat the record number of malnourished children brought in, especially as the hospitals have not been able to access the needed medications.

Dominican Republic

Pray for the pastoral retreat of Iglesia de los Hermanos, the Church of the Brethren in the Dominican Republic, being held December 8-10 in San Cristobol. Approximately 150 participants will gather for times of worship, fellowship, Bible study, and discussion of Brethren beliefs and practices. Pray for Church of the Brethren pastors Marla Bieber Abe and Galen Hackman as they travel to the Dominican Republic to lead the Brethren beliefs and practices sessions during the retreat. Galen's book on this topic will be a basis for the sessions. The two also will visit Iglesia de los Hermanos congregations and attend an inauguration ceremony for a new theological training space.

Vietnam

Pray for a new medical social work initiative organized by Global Mission worker [Grace Mishler](#), working with the eye care unit of Children's Hospital 1 in Ho Chi Minh City. The initiative focuses especially on babies with Retinopathy of Prematurity, an eye disease that can cause blindness. Grace and volunteers with the initiative gather data on hundreds of families, facilitate a parent support group, organize training for early intervention, raise funds, and investigate potential environmental issues for the high rates of premature births within a certain rural area in Vietnam. Pray that this initiative can continue to build up the capacity of the hospital and find ways to preserve the eyesight of the children.

Honduras

Chet Thomas, Church of the Brethren member and executive director of Proyecto Aldea Global (PAG), requests prayer for the people of Honduras, as the country is divided over the contested results of the November 26 presidential election. The confrontations have led to protests, riots, and destruction of public buildings, and many vital transportation services across the country are on hold. Amnesty International reports that at least 14 people have been killed and dozens injured when gunfire has erupted at demonstrations. According to Thomas, the crisis threatens the stability of a country that has experienced relative peace and achieved significant economic and social improvements in recent years. Pray for mediation and a peaceful resolution to the conflict, with understanding and compromise from the various parties. Pray for the development work of PAG, which has reduced its activities until the conflict is resolved.

United States

Palestine and Israel

Pray for the people of Jerusalem, where tensions are high following US President Donald Trump's recognition of the city as the capital of Israel. The Church of the Brethren's [Office of Public Witness](#) has issued the following statement: *The Trump Administration announced the decision to relocate the United States embassy to Jerusalem, and to recognize Jerusalem as the capital of Israel. This development is disappointing, as it sets the peace process back and ignites the potential for violent reactions from impacted communities. The unilateral decision to recognize Jerusalem as the capital is not conducive to a successful peace process in the region.*

The Church of the Brethren addressed the possibility of such a relocation in a [1996 Statement on Jerusalem](#), which said: "We also urge the United States government to maintain an active and balanced role in the peace process, recognizing its unique relationship with the government of Israel, the legitimate claims of the Palestinian people, and the importance of a just and equitable resolution of the status of Jerusalem. Toward this aim, the U.S. embassy in Tel Aviv should not be relocated until the permanent status negotiations on Jerusalem are concluded." The [1980 Threats to Peace statement](#) addressed the Israeli-Palestinian conflict more broadly, saying: "Furthermore, we commend efforts of our government to achieve a resolution of the Israeli-Palestinian conflict which include a termination of the violence and counter-violence, a mutual recognition of sovereign entities, and a just solution and compensation for those persons uprooted by the conflict since 1948."

Pray for political leaders in the United States to be infused with courage and wisdom so that they may act for the good of global peace. Pray for all of us as United States citizens to hold our elected officials accountable. Pray for an end to the illegal and unjust Israeli occupation of Palestine, which threatens the welfare of both Palestinians and Israelis.



United States

Pray for everyone affected by the wildfires in southern California. The California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection reports that 98,000 people have been evacuated with 25,000 homes affected by five different wildfires. The biggest, the Thomas fire, spans 230,000 acres. Pray for provision for those who have fled their homes. Pray for safety for the 9,000 firefighters working to contain the blazes. Pray for relief. Pray for the team of [Children's Disaster Services](#) volunteers serving children and families affected by this natural disaster. Pray that they may bring some comfort in a time of fear and uncertainty.


