

2019 Moderator's Message

As we come to the start of a new year and all of the Christmas decorations and trappings have been put away, we begin the hurried tasks of getting together information for our taxes, planning for bible studies and events in our churches, and making plans for what the remainder of the year may bring. It's also



(and perhaps more importantly) a time for self-examination.

Sometimes, when things are going along so well, we tend to forget how much we really need and depend upon God. The prophet Elijah experienced something very similar to this. We read in I Kings 19 how, immediately following the defeat of the prophets of Baal, Queen Jezebel ordered Elijah's death. He immediately fled into the wilderness for fear of his life. His victory all of a sudden seemed hollow and he was really up against it. All of his life he had sought God and so now he was perplexed. We recall how God appeared to him in the form of a great wind that shattered the rocks and the mountains but God was not in that wind. Then a great earthquake came but God was not the earthquake. After that came fire but God was not in the fire. Immediately following that Elisha heard a very quiet wind and he found the voice of God in that wind.

So often, when we find ourselves in a bind we try to work things out ourselves. Instead we need to stop and take time to silence ourselves, to separate ourselves from the noise of this world and find ourselves. We must immerse ourselves in prayer and in God's Word. By evoking the power of the Holy Spirit into our lives we enhance our closeness with God and our faith-walk becomes even more complete.

May you all be blessed with a happy Christ-filled 2019!



The Pastor and Parish Ministry Team of our District invites pastors and church members to share in this seminar as we seek to strengthen our understanding of the current epidemic of pornography as it effects the lives of Christians. Christians who use pornography can develop unbiblical and self –destructive ways of relating to others. They often withdraw from active involvement in marriage, family, and the life of the Church.

The Seminar will be led by Harvest USA. Pastoral Care & Crisis Intervention III Congregational Care

Hello Pastors...

Enclosed here is information on a new series of continuing education opportunities that the Western PA District Pastor and Parish Team will be offering over the coming year. Let me tell you about them. But first, let's discuss a few things. It is all too common that what affects one person will usually affect a number of others, usually their families and close friends. How could it not? However, what do we do when the crisis now is so monumental that it is having a large impact upon the entire congregation, not just one or two people or even a family?

That is why I am sending this to you and trust that you will take a moment to read this carefully. I have found over the last 27 years that many pastors, deacons and counselors truly struggle with what to say or do for people they are helping when the disaster strikes. This is why I urge you to read further and why we are offering this series of continuing education opportunities.

Over the course of this year, we will offer parts three and four of our four-part series on Pastoral Crisis Intervention. These one-day courses will begin with the most basic of skills needed by pastors to begin to offer spiritual support and comfort to persons in their care and will build upon the previous trainings as we make our way through the series.

Pastoral Crisis Intervention III

This course will begin immediately where **Intervention II** ends and will be building upon those basic skills. This training will now move the pastor into utilizing those skills within the larger context of the Congregational and Large Group setting. This course will explore:

-Vocabulary and Congregational/Group Dynamics during Crises

-Listening Skills

-Biblical Foundations

-Understanding Large Group Dynamics

-Congregational/Group Interventional Practice



Dale Leverknight currently serves as pastor of the Montgomery Church of the Brethren in Western PA. He draws on years of experience in pastoral care, counseling, and emergency services. He has a BS degree in Biblical Studies/Theology and an MA in Christian Counseling, both from Eastern Mennonite University.

Pastoral Care and Crisis Intervention is a series of four sessions (March 30 and October 26, 2019, and two TBA in 2020), which will provide the most basic skills pastors need to begin to offer spiritual support and comfort to persons in our care. The sessions will benefit deacons and other lay leaders, in addition to pastors. While the sessions build upon one another, you will gain valuable information even if you can attend only one session. It has been determined that the Church of the Brethren shall turn its attention to the framing of a COMPELLING VISION. To undergird this multiyear process, a special prayer gathering has been planned for March 29 & 30, 2019 in Harrisonburg, Va., at the Rockingham County Fairgrounds. This event follows the Prayer and Worship Summit held earlier in 2018 at the same place that called us to prayer for the future of the denomination and attended by about 400 Brethren.

The 2019 Prayer and Worship Summit "PRAYING FOR THE VISION" is an opportunity for Brethren to unite, to earnestly seek God's direction and for the Holy Spirit to guide us in becoming the church we are meant to be for this age and into the future. This Prayer Summit is not for doing any business. We will not be putting any pieces of the COMPELLING VISION together. We will be addressing the spiritual dynamics that are necessary in seeking the mind of God for this process.

The speakers and prayer time will focus on "Vision Lost," "Vision Recaptured" and "Vision Launched." The answer in getting all this right is to PRAY, PRAY, PRAY! We need the praying hearts and praying hands of many Brethren from all across our land to open up our lives in a new way to hear from Heaven and be guided by God's Word.



Ohio: Potsdam Community Garden Celebration

In August, the Potsdam (Ohio) Church of the Brethren held its second annual Corn Fest. Pastor Carl Hill reports that over 100 people attended, many who were not church members. The festival included live music. Fresh produce from the church's community garden was served. The GFI has provided two \$1,000 grants to support this effort. Haiti: Beans, Fish and Coffee

A collaboration between Eglise des Freres d' Haiti (Church of the Brethren in Haiti), Foods Resource Bank and the GFI is only in its first year but beginning to bear fruit. Staff for Eglise des Freres are busy installing fish ponds, tree nurseries, distributing goats for a "passing on the gift" style animal project, and much more. This program is underway in 10 communities, with 25 farmers in each community. The focus is on soil conservation and income generation.





Burundi: Farming God's Way

A grant totaling \$8,944 was given to Trauma Healing and Reconciliation Services (THARS) for its work teaching farming to members of the Batwa tribe in Burundi. The GFI has provided grants for the past 3 years to this project. THARS director, Dr. David Niyonzima, reports impressive yields using a technique called Farming God's Way (FGW). Using mulch, compost, and proper spacing of seeds at planting, farmers are reporting harvests of up to 10 times the harvest using traditional farming methods. FGW encourages care for creation through Bible-based teachings on stewardship. To date, THARS has trained approximately 100 farmers in its Farmer Field School for Sustainable Development activities. Each farmer is encouraged to share knowledge with neighbors, so when family members and neighbors are included, THARS estimates that over 3,000 people have been positively impacted through this project to date.

Ecuador: New Grant

The GFI recently awarded a \$5,000 grant to Fundacion Brethren y Unida (FBU) in Ecuador. Funds will be used to support FBU's Indigenous Food Crops project, and will go for the purchase of seed, vegetable seedlings, and organic fertilizer. Community trainings, and "ferrias" or farmers' markets, will be organized in 5 communities. The project will seek to engage young adults ages 25-35 to encourage them to remain on family farms. FBU is part of a national alliance in Ecuador to promote healthy food and is actively involved in the Slow Food movement.



This follows a grant of \$3,000 given to FBU in 2017. A report from FBU shows that they were able to exceed their expectations for the year. FBU staff organized 8 workshops for 400 participants in 4 communities. Together, staff and participants established 9 demonstration gardens and planted 1850 trees.

The Church of the Brethren was involved in the founding of FBU in 1953, and works in the Tabacundo section, about 41 kilometers from Quito. GFI manager, Jeff Boshart, has been invited to serve as a member of FBU's board of directors as a way of reestablishing ties between the Church of the Brethren and FBU.



Virginia: World Hunger Auction

On August 11, 2018, over 100 people gathered at the Antioch (Va.) Church of the Brethren to open their hearts and wallets to assist people in need both locally and internationally. This year marked the 35th anniversary of the event. Along with the auction, other activities are held throughout the year. The total raised this year was more than \$31,000. Funds are shared with Heifer International, the Global Food Initiative (GFI) as well as local organizations.

Nigeria Soy Consultation or U of IL SIL update

In September, GFI manager Jeff Boshart traveled to Nigeria accompanied by Dr. Dennis Thompson of the University of Illinois, and Dr. Steven Petcher of Petcher Seed Company, Fruitdale, Alabama. The delegation was hosted by the Soybean Value Chain Team, that is made up of agricultural professionals who are all members of Ekklesiyar Yan'uwa a Nigeria. This team is made up primarily of volunteers who have been working with farmers in the promotion of soybeans as a cash crop, as well as for household consumption. The project is funded primarily through a \$25,000 allocation from the Nigeria Crisis Fund of the Church of the Brethren with staff support from the GFI. During this week-long consultation, the team was able to visit

farmers to hear testimonies of the value of this project. Rains have been good this year and the harvest looks to be exceptional. One farmer from the town of Golantabal sold his crop from last season and exclaimed, "I enjoyed the money I received from the sale of my soybeans very much!" The president of a women's cooperative near Abuja shared that the cooperative has added both members and acreage this year as growing soybeans is profitable. The cooperative is planning to start a business selling processed soy foods.


Information from Camp....






