#### **MESSAGE FROM THE MODERATOR**


Happy New Year!!





Please note, the shoes collected DO NOT go directly to the Honduras Orphanage. The shoes go to Funds2orgs, which turns collected shoes into cash. This money is then given to the Orphanage for their needs. The shoes you collect also serve as a philanthropic bridge to give people a hand-up and work opportunity, rather than just a hand-out. Micro-entrepreneurs set up small businesses. They sell the shoes you gather in their communities, which creates business and commerce opportunities leading to sustainability.

#### Faith Statement on Escalating Violence with Iran

The Church of the Brethren is one of the denominations that have signed a statement on escalating tensions with Iran. The statement was issued January 3, 2020. It says, in part:

"As people of faith, we condemn the United States' dangerous aggression towards Iran, including the assassination of Gen. Qassem Soleimani and the deployment of additional troops to the region. We urge the Administration to step back from the brink of war. Our faith communities see the futility of war, and its power to dehumanize. We know that human flourishing entails breaking cycles of violence, being courageous peacemakers, and focusing on the root causes of conflict. Violent conflict is a path of mutual destruction. Instead, all actors must move forward in a way that upholds our shared, sacred human dignity."

**Global Mission and Service is calling for prayer for Pastor Lawan Andimi,** a district leader in Ekklesiyar Yan'uwa a Nigeria (EYN, the Church of the Brethren in Nigeria) who has been abducted by a faction of Boko Haram. "Please pray for our brother in Nigeria," said the request. Andimi was abducted from the town of Michika in Adamawa State in northeast Nigeria. A release from Christian Solidarity Worldwide, published by "The Nigerian Voice" reported that Andimi also chairs the Christian Association of Nigeria in Adamawa State, and that he was declared missing following a raid on Michika on January 3, 2020. A video of Andimi speaking in English and Hausa has been released by his captors, in which he expresses his faith in God. Find the article

# Brethren Disaster Ministries and district leaders report from Puerto Rico following earthquakes

Brethren Disaster Ministries staff and church leaders in Puerto Rico have reported in following a series of large earthquakes. The denomination's disaster ministry is working in Puerto Rico doing hurricane repair and rebuilding, in collaboration with Puerto Rico District of the Church of the Brethren.

Jenn Dorsch-Messler, director of Brethren Disaster Ministries, reported following telephone calls and email exchanges with district executive José Calleja and district disaster coordinator José Acevedo as well as Brethren Disaster Ministries long-term volunteer Carrie Miller.

"We are ok, so far. Keep praying for us," said Calleja. "Our churches are good and our pastors are okay. I have activated a district fasting and prayer chain for our island starting on January 13 thru February the 2nd.

At this time, no serious damage to buildings and no injuries or deaths are reported among Church of the Brethren members and congregations in Puerto Rico. Despite communication difficulties, the district is working to get status updates from all of the churches and members.

The main effect of the earthquakes was in the southwest and west of the island although the earthquakes were felt strongly throughout Puerto Rico, reported Dorsch-Messler. In the northern areas, houses that were old and not well made were affected. People living on the coast were worried about the possibility of a tsunami although authorities said there was no risk of one.

"We are getting many reports from other denominations of churches that are damaged and specifically more widespread is the PTSD that losing power and water and being in shelters has brought on for so many Hurricane Maria survivors," said Dorsch-Messler.

Brethren Disaster Ministries is calling for prayer for all affected by the earthquakes, those who are nervous to go back into buildings for fear of further shocks, with special concern for those living in some of the poorer areas that were affected.

#### Workcamp locations for summer 2020 include Rwanda



#### MODERATOR'S FORUM SLATED FOR APRIL 18, 2020

#### FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE

ELGIN, IL – Church of the Brethren Annual Conference Moderator Paul Mundey has announced that he will be hosting a Moderator's Forum this spring. The event will take place at the Young Center for Anabaptist and Pietist Studies at Elizabethtown College, Elizabethtown, PA. The date is April 18, 2020 from 1-9 p.m.

The forum's focus is "Historical Themes Impacting Today's Church." It will feature leading Brethren historians who will address a variety of historical themes impacting present-day congregations, districts, and national structures. Particular attention will be given to Brethren history and themes relevant to the current reality of Brethren communions, with special emphasis on the Church of the Brethren.

Themes to be addressed include accountability, compelling vision, division, forbearance, and nationalism.

Historians participating include Jeff Bach, Director, Young Center for Anabaptist and Pietist Studies, Associate Professor, Department of Religious Studies, Elizabethtown College; William Kostlevy, Director, Brethren Historical Library and Archives; Stephen Longenecker, Edwin L. Turner Distinguished Professor of History, Bridgewater College; Carol Scheppard, Professor of the College, Professor of Philosophy and Religion, Bridgewater College; and Dale Stoffer, Emeritus Professor of Historical Theology, Ashland Theological Seminary.

The forum will conclude with an evening worship service and a message from Dennis Webb, a leading Church of the Brethren preacher and pastor of Naperville (Illinois) Church of the Brethren.

The forum is open to both clergy and laity. Registration cost, which includes dinner, is \$30.00. For those attending the entire event, point six (0.6) CEU's (Continuing Education Units) are also available for an additional cost of \$10.00. The evening worship, beginning with hymn singing at 7 p.m., is open to the public without cost or registration and will be held in the Gibble Auditorium on the Elizabethtown College campus. 


