FROM THE DISTRICT MODERATOR

I made a few comments, at District Conference (DC), after a very meaningful installation service. Knowing that I had to select a theme for the year, I began thinking about that a number of months before DC. I spent time in praying, pondering and thinking about a challenging theme for this year. I had numerous ideas, but finally settled on, "Bound Together by Prayer." I could have selected a number of scriptures which highlighted what I wanted to focus on but finally settled on Romans 15:5-6. The phrase which caught my attention was, "May the God who gives endurance and

encouragement give you a spirit of unity among yourselves as you follow Christ Jesus."

So, the question for us and for our faith communities in the Western PA District is, "What will or can give us a spirit of 'unity among ourselves, and our faith communities, as you follow Christ Jesus." How do you or I answer this question? For me it begins with prayer, which I stated in my

remarks at DC. I believe unity can be achieved when we pray with an open heart, mind, and spirit. We need to focus on the positive, rather than on the negative and that which we may not agree on.

Would you be willing to join me in praying regularly for each of the congregations in the district? Pray for four or five congregations a day and in ten days to two weeks you will be able to start over. I would suggest praying for the faithful members of that faith community, the pastor, leaders, and any special needs you may be aware of in that congregation. For me that will help in fulfilling verse 6. "... so that with one heart and mouth you may glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ."

Let's begin by putting that verse into practice. Seeking through our prayer time to focus on what is positive in the ministry happening in our faith communities. "Bound Together by Prayer," happens when we allow the Holy Spirit to guide, challenge and encourage us each day.

Worship as a faith community is valuable and allows us to praise God together. I feel it allows me then to go forth to put my faith into practice each day of the week. To focus on the positive and seek unity as we serve our risen Lord and Savior. So, what are the positives you can indentify in your spiritual journey? What inspires and encourages you each day in your walk with the Lord? You may have one or a number which are positives for you. I would encourage you write them down, so you can see

them on a regular basis. You may start out with one or two and you can continue to add to the list as you experience positive areas of ministry as an individual and/or as a faith community. It would be encouraging to have you share these

> positive experiences with me. I might like to share them with others with your permission. I'm sure many of them may be the same, but what you share, might inspire and encourage someone else in their faith commitment and journey. My email address is:

I pray you will take a few minutes of time to think about the positive ministries happening in your life and congregation and write them

down and then share them with me.

Paul talked about unity in Colossians 3:14, "And over all these virtues put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity." He suggests that unity can be achieved when we forgive others as Christ has forgiven us. Being "Bound Together by Prayer," will help us make at least a first step in seeking unity in our faith communities and in the Western PA District. It may not happen overnight, but I believe if we are faithful in focusing in our prayer time on the positive, God will bless, encourage and help us achieve unity.

As pastors and leaders in local faith communities I would invite you to begin by naming a positive in your spiritual journey? Put it in the bulletin or at least mention in your worship time. Then invite others to share in the same way. I'm looking forward to hearing from many of you how individuals are responding to this challenge.

CONTINUING EDUCATION OPPORTUNITIES

BRETHREN ACADEMY

The Brethren Academy will offer this online course, *What Brethren Believe*, from April 19 - June 13, 2023. Denise Kettering-Lane, assistant professor of Brethren Studies at Bethany Theological Seminary, will be the instructor and TRIM students will receive one credit in Bible/Theology upon completion, and the BTS experience after writing the required report. These online classes "meet" for 8 weeks in Moodle, a virtual classroom platform. New lessons are posted once a week, once the course begins, and students are given a week to complete their assignments. Students can log on at any time, day or night, to read lectures, watch videos, work on group projects and/or engage in forums (emailstyle conversations) with their classmates. In this way, online courses are fairly flexible.

Brethren Academy students will use their Moodle account information. Passwords can be reset if need be. Non-Academy students will be provided with Moodle account information. Pastors completing this course will earn 2 continuing education units or persons may take it for personal enrichment.

Continuing Education Units (CEUs) are awarded after the instructor has notified the Brethren Academy of successful completion of the course.

Successful completion is defined by the following:

- Meeting the attendance requirement
- Completing the assigned reading
- Engaging in the course through participation
- Completing reduced assignments that may be required by the instructor and outlined in the syllabus.

From the Breaking Down Barriers Study Committee



Seventh Brethren World Assembly will celebrate 300 years of the Brethren in America


