Some Thoughts and Reflections on the Upcoming 2019 Annual Conference

from District Minister Bill Wenger

Next week the 2019 Annual Conference will begin in Greensboro, North Carolina. The main task of this conference is for the delegates to contribute their thoughts and perspective on the content of a "Compelling Vision" for our Church of the Brethren For as the body is one, and has many members, and all the members of that one body, being many, are one body: so also is Christ.

-1 Corinthians 12:12

denomination. The Compelling Vision process is aimed at helping our denomination formulate a vision statement that will enable us to understand how we can best strengthen the mission of Christ in our congregations, in our communities, and in the world. The hope is "to find pathways to increased effectiveness in our ministry together as a denomination, in the midst of our diversity, and in some cases, division" (a quote from the Compelling Vision Process Team.)

The Compelling Vision Process Team wants it to be clear that the goal of this year's compelling vision work is not to make statements or decisions about the theological and ethical issues that divide us as a denomination. The thoughts gathered from the delegates this year will be given to a writing team who will then craft a vision statement from the data they have. Numbers of conservative Brethren people have expressed discouragement at the length of this process and doubt whether it will produce a vision that will truly call the COB to biblical faithfulness and renewed power in the Lord. At the same time, conservative Brethren are also hopeful that God might move mightily through this process and that the COB might truly be reformed spiritually.

To be honest, no one knows how this all will play out. It may lead to a renewed faithfulness in the COB, one in which conservative Brethren find their place with joy. It may lead to disappointment on the part of conservative Brethren if the compelling vision process produces little to help the COB spiritually. No matter what may come, our hope is that the churches of the Western PA District will remain together in a spirit of unity as we see how all this does play out. If a new biblical faithfulness arises in the COB, then we will be together as a district sharing in that wonderful blessing.

If a new biblical clarity and faithfulness does not seem to be developing, then we will be together as discussions perhaps would begin at the denominational level as to how conservative and progressives can part ways peacefully.

Again, it is not clear at all what may happen. But if our district churches stay together and work together, we will be in a position to share together in the life of a renewed COB that may arise. Or we will be able to share together in new blessings that come as God would lead us into an arrangement with other conservative churches in other districts as a new denominational body.

I ask you to not attribute any conclusive power to my words above, for no one knows what may come of all this, and I do not want anyone to think that I am predicting or promising anything about any future course for the churches of our district. My goal in writing this to you is simply to encourage us to remain together, so that in the future we can still be in fellowship with one another, find strength in one another's faith, and work together on mission projects for Christ's glory.



May God grant us grace to be faithful to His will and purposes. He will lead us aright.
