In a recent prayer time, I heard the LORD say to me: "Don't be so afraid; live out of the victory I have given you in Jesus."

The verse quoted above from I Corinthians is in the context of Christ giving us victory over death. There is a sense of liberty in the passage, one of complete joy and exultation that in Christ even death has no victory over God's people.

I encourage you to begin to say and believe that "We have the victory in Jesus. We can do things to see our church thrive. We can live out of the victory that Jesus has won for us!"

May our District churches grow in faith and number as we trust in Christ's victory over all things. May new Christians be born, inactive members restored, new ministries begun, and the healings of bodies and relationships occur. In Christ is it not "Oh no!" but "It can be! It can happen! Praise Jesus!"







#### AbbsTract June 2017

As a kid growing up, I looked forward to Pentecost Sunday (and not just because it often coincided with the end of school). Pentecost meant that our church sanctuary would be awash in various shades of red – from the banners on the walls to the shirts, ties and dresses of the people. The choir would sing "Come, Holy Spirit," a song which talks about the move of God's Spirit through the ages. And sometimes, especially if I'd had a recent growth spurt, I got to go shopping for a new "something red" to wear.







As an adult in the Church of the Brethren, I look at Pentecost a little differently – to be honest, it kind of makes me sad. It seems that this one Sunday is all the time we dedicate to acknowledging the Holy Spirit. In fact, I often hear people refer to God's Spirit as "it." Like He is some kind of unknown spectral phenomenon, instead of the third Person of the Holy Trinity. Granted, He always comes last in the list, but that's no reason to relegate Him to the one-Sunday-per-year heap.

My theory for this behavior on the part of the Church is this: we're scared of the Holy Spirit. Not in the way that we're terrified of "ghosts" while walking through an old house after dark, but scared of Him in the way that we are of anyone we can't predict or control. For the most part, people like predictability and people like to have (at least an illusion of) control. We like to know what to expect with others, especially when it comes to stability in our life of faith.

Let's be honest: new ideas are met with wariness and resistance in the Church. If someone shares a new idea, we are sometimes taken aback, and we question their motives. We want to know every possible contingency and result before we are willing to start into something new. What will it cost? How long will it take? How will it work? What's my guarantee? What's in it for us? Why shouldn't we just keep things the same? That's how we tend to operate. But the Holy Spirit doesn't owe us answers, and we don't like that.

The Spirit's arrival in Jerusalem that day caused more than a stir. Scripture says that everyone was astonished, astounded, perplexed. The disciples were thought to be drunk. Nobody knew what to make of it! But even that was small potatoes compared to the unpredictable thing that happened next. After Peter shared the Gospel message with power and boldness, about three thousand people gave their hearts and lives to Jesus Christ. Three thousand! In a matter of moments, the first mega-church was born. And that was just the beginning (Acts 2). Brothers and sisters, we need to stop trying to "figure out" the Holy Spirit, and simply submit to His authority in our lives. We need to be filled with the Spirit, that He might teach us and guide us and comfort us. The Greek name given to the Holy Spirit is "Paráklētos," or "person called in to help." And boy, do we need help. We need help to live this life for Jesus. We need help to grow His Church out of her death-spiral. We need help to choose another way of living in this dark and dying world. Instead of fearing what the Holy Spirit might ask us to do, we should be throwing open the doors of our lives and our churches to His leading. Caution has its place, but not when it comes to doing God's work in God's way. Sometimes we need to take those sacred risks.

If you are avoiding or ignoring the Holy Spirit today, I invite you to take some time, right now, to pray and ask God to soften your heart. Admit your fear and hesitation, and ask Him to give you peace. Open your Bible and ask God to teach you about the Holy Spirit – who He is, how He works, and what He wants to do in your life. Let us join together as a District to pray with boldness for the massive, regional revival that only God's Spirit can bring, and let us be ready to fearlessly embrace it when it comes!

#### **Special District Conference Recap:**

A Special Session of the Western PA District Conference was held at the Maple Spring Church of the Brethren on Saturday, April 20, 2017. The purpose of the session was to discuss the current financial situation at the Brethren Home in Windber PA. There were 92 delegates and 35 non-delegates representing 51 churches in the District, as well as leadership from the Brethren Home, Camp Harmony, and the District Leadership Team.

After the session was called to order and instructions were given to the delegates in attendance, District Leadership Team Chair Ed Houghton began with an explanation of the current financial situation at the Brethren Home. He stated that "Over the past three years, the Brethren Home has sustained heavy financial losses and is deeply in debt. The Core Team of the District Leadership Team voted on April 18th to approve a loan from First Commonwealth Bank of \$600,000 to help the Home pay its vendors and creditors. This sum will not meet all of the accounts payable but will at least give the Home the chance to continue its operations. We feel that this situation is one that the Core Team can no longer address by itself without the knowledge and guidance of the District Conference. We are looking to this Conference to begin a discussion on the Brethren Home's future financial stability, administration, and viability as a ministry of our District."

The motion was then brought before the District Conference:

The Core Team of the Western PA District Church of the Brethren are requesting of the emergency District Conference, its <u>ratification</u> of the \$600,000 loan by the First Commonwealth Bank to the Church of the Brethren home. (The loan has already been approved and paid out to the Home, the Core Team was seeking ratification from the District Conference)

After a lengthy discussion regarding the loan and the financial situation of the Home, a vote took place.

# The vote was as follows: 69 YES votes to approve the ratification and 16 NO votes, the ratification passes.

After the vote, Donna Smith, Chair of the District Stewards and Finance Team discussed the Home's current financial situation and how it can affect the District. There was a time of questions and discussion with Brethren Home CEO Tom Reckner, members of the Home Board, District Conference delegates and non-delegates, and District Leadership all sharing opinions and sharing information.

District Leadership Team Chair presented alternative actions for the Home. **Option #1** is affiliation where a new or existing entity would be given authority to actively take over and manage the administration of the Home. **Option #2** Sale of the Home to a new or existing entity at a fair market value. **Option #3** Continue as is, the bank has given the Home and the District some big hurdles to jump through as part of the \$600,000 loan, 22 total in total. After those options were presented, the following motion was made:

To have the Core Team and whoever else is responsible look into researching the sale of the Home and bring it back to the District Conference. It was seconded and another vote was taken: 70 YES votes to approve researching the sale of the Home, 12 NO votes, and 1 Abstained.

#### **Special District Conference Recap continued:**

The Western PA District is now also responsible for assisting in the repayment of the \$600,000. To that end, First Commonwealth Bank has mandated a "minimum effort" for fundraising. From the First Commonwealth Loan Proposal: "Minimum best effort of the Western PA District Church of the Brethren to conduct a fundraising effort to support operations of the borrower; 50% of these proceeds will go to the maintenance reserve account and the remaining 50% would go to the pay off this time note."

All funds that are raised for the loan repayment effort must be made out to the Western PA District and sent to the District Office. Please mark on the memo line of all checks: \$600,000 debt reduction. At the end of each month, when the allocation go out, the funds brought in for the debt reduction will be taken directly to First Commonwealth Bank and deposited and credited to the loan repayment.

At that point in the Conference, a special offering was taken. Those in attendance that day raised \$3,475.00 toward repayment of the \$600,000 loan. To date another \$1,700.00 has been given bringing the total to \$5,175.00.

The Special Session of the Western PA District Conference was closed with a prayer led by District Leadership Team Chair Ed Houghton and the meeting was adjourned.

In the weeks since the Special District Conference, Brethren Home Sale Committee has been selected and will begin the process of doing research into the sale of the Brethren Home and also how to pay down the loan from First Commonwealth Bank. The BHSC is as follows:





# EYN confirms release of 82 Chibok schoolgirls in prisoner swap

"I waited patiently for the Lord; he inclined to me and heard my cry" (Psalm 40:1).

President Joel S. Billi of Ekklesiyar Yan'uwa a Nigeria (EYN, the Church of the Brethren in Nigeria) has confirmed news reports of the release of 82 of the Chibok schoolgirls who were abducted by Boko Haram in April 2014. Media are reporting that the girls were released to the Nigerian government by Boko Haram on

Saturday, in exchange for five Boko Haram suspects.

"Yes, it is true that 82 more Chibok girls have been released," said Billi in an e-mail to Jay Wittmeyer, executive director of Global Mission and Service for the Church of the Brethren. "I will keep you informed about every detail in due course," he added. In a follow up e-mail, he confirmed media reports that the freed girls have been taken to Abuja, Nigeria's capital city.

Nigeria Crisis Response staff Roxane Hill reported that "we don't know when and if the girls will be allowed to return to Chibok." (See "Nigeria Chibok girls: Parents learning if daughters among those freed," www.bbc.com/news/world-africa-39846326.)

Hill shared a list of the names of the 82 released girls, which was taken from an announcement by the office of the president of Nigeria and was sent to her by a leading EYN member who is active in efforts for education in Nigeria. However, the names have not yet been confirmed by EYN leadership. (See http://alphaplusmag.com/see-names-of-82-rescued-chibok-girls.)

Concerns remain for the hundreds of other children and adults who have been abducted by Boko Haram over recent years, and who continue as captives.

In response to queries about how to offer financial support to the released girls and their families, the Nigeria Crisis Fund will receive donations for that purpose. Brethren Disaster Ministries will work with EYN to oversee the use of the donations.

"We will work with EYN to provide resources and support to the girls," said Roy Winter, associate executive director of Global Mission and Service and Brethren Disaster Ministries associate.

Donations may be made to the Nigeria Crisis Fund, with a note that the gift is made to support the Chibok schoolgirls, and mailed to the Church of the Brethren, 1451 Dundee Ave., Elgin, IL 60120.

#### **Global Mission Prayer Guide**

#### **Honduras**

Pray for Global Mission workers <u>Kay and Alan Bennett</u> as they continue their service in the community of Belén Gualcho. Pray for the success of a water pipeline project that will provide drinking and crop-growing water to several communities who have been without a reliable water source. Alan and his colleagues from Proyecto Aldea Global

work persistently in repairing and replacing the pipe's joints that are causing hundreds of leaks

#### Nigeria

Pray for Pam and Dave Reist of Elizabethtown (Pa.) Church of the Brethren as they travel to Nigeria, where they will volunteer for two months with Ekklesiyar Yan'uwa a Nigeria (EYN, the Church of the Brethren in Nigeria). The Reists will assist with a variety of EYN ministries including Kulp Bible College, the peace program, the disaster response team, agricultural development, a workcamp, and women theologians. Pray for a time of mutual service and learning.

#### **Democratic Republic of Congo**

Give thanks and pray for the work of SHAMIRED (Shalom Ministry for Reconciliation and Development), a ministry of the Congolese Brethren. The ministry engages in agricultural development with the Twa people, training these displaced huntergatherers to grow bananas, corn, cassava, and potatoes. Both this ministry and a similar outreach program of the Rwandan Brethren receive support from the Global Food Initiative. Recent program evaluations by program evaluations by Eben-ezer University show that the projects in both countries have shown steady progress in the past four years.

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## **Global Mission Updates**

#### **Global Mission Prayer Guide**



#### **Syria**

Ask God's comfort and solace for Syrians injured in body, mind, or soul. Pray for victims of chemical gas attacks, missile and bomb strikes, and the many other means of violence that ravage the country. Pray that leaders of Syria, the United States, Russia, and other countries stop their participation in this war. Pray fervently for peace.

#### Colombia

Pray for the community of Mocoa, which was struck by deadly landslides and flooding last week. At least 300 people lost their lives, with hundreds more missing or injured. Thousands of families lost their homes or possessions, and there is a severe shortage of safe drinking water. Pray for relief and recovery.

#### **Democratic Republic of Congo**

Pray for an end to the mass killing and violence. Recently, numerous mass graves containing the bodies of hundreds of civilians and military or militia members have been found in the central Kasai region. Victims included two United Nations humanitarian workers, one of whom was an American Mennonite. Pray for Congolese families whose lives have been torn apart by violence and for Congolese children who have never known peace. Pray for a just and stable government transition that may help alleviate some of the fighting between government forces and opposition militias.

#### **Egypt**

Pray for the victims of two suicide bombings that struck Coptic churches during Palm Sunday services in Alexandria and Tanta. Pray for those who grieve and those who were injured. Pray for those motivated by fear or hatred to carry out such attacks. Pray for the prevention of equally fear-based retaliations.



FINANCIAL REPORT: Members of the Home administration met with a special session of the Western PA District Conference on April 29 at the Maple Spring COB. The purpose of the meeting was to inform all district churches of the Home's current financial situation, potential options for the future of the Home, and the District's role in that process. After lengthy discussion concerning the welfare of our residents, the mission of benevolent care, and fiscal responsibility, the District Conference voted to organize a committee composed of the District Core Leadership Team and Brethren Home Administrators to look into researching the sale of Home and bring it back to the District Conference. The Home has already instituted some measures to stabilize the Home's financial situation, however love donations from churches of any amount to reduce indebtedness would be welcome.

*VOLUNTEERS HONORED:* From March 1, 2016 – February 28, 2017, volunteers shared over 5,000 hours of time, talent, and treasure with the Home. The average Home volunteer spent over 40 hours at the Home during that time. To honor their dedication and generosity, a banquet was held at the Scalp Level church social room on May 2. Home dietary director Shawn Boast and his staff provided a delicious dinner and the Evergreens, a musical group from Johnstown provided the entertainment. #### **NEWS UPDATE**

"After nine years and thousands of dollars dealing with all the problems of our Sand Mounds, one was opened last year under the direction of our township and DEP supervisors and they mandated that the biggest mound be fixed. This direction will keep Camp open and functioning while we also work with connecting Brougher retreat center to the system. Please don't hesitate to come and see the progress. Donations are being accepted for this ongoing Clean Water Project. God has been sending us the proper individuals to keep your ministry going. If you have any questions or concerns, feel free to ask." Printed in last month's Highlights...and the story continues.... Last week (May 4) we went to connect the corrected mounds back to our 4 buried septic tanks. After getting them pumped out - one was full of dirt and rocks, resulting in the discovery that one tank was collapsed and the other 3 tanks had cracks in them, meaning they had to be replaced. We called in our insurance company, but they have termed it "wear and tear over time" and no help is being offered. On Monday – Wednesday (May 9 – 11) 4 tanks were installed to the expense of \$30,000+.

In the meantime we had to postpone the Women's Ministries Retreat from the District. For that we are very sorry. Camp was literally closed and porta-johns were brought in.

Four tanks have been installed and we are close to attaching on to the system. Our group of 60 coming in this weekend (May 13) is arriving. This morning (May 13), our engineer, a representative from DEP, and two Camp Board members were present to look at the complete picture. They are coming to the initial conclusion that the improvements that are presently happening may be enough to cover the needs of Camp for the next 15 - 30 years pending that all these repairs result in a working system. This would save Camp \$300,000+ for a possible future treatment plant.

When we started the Clean Water Project, we had enough donations – private and from 2 congregations totaling \$30,000 . However the domino effect has hit and now you know the rest of the story. Please pray for your Camp Harmony ministry and if you or your congregation feel led to donate towards this past week's extra outlay for finances – all would be appreciated so the work of the Lord continues. As I finish this easy to understand description of a very complex dilemma, our first people are arriving from all over the US. Thank you for reading and understanding. #### Good old fashioned rule days

February marked the beginning of another school year for the children at Hogar Enmanuel. Although the Honduran school system offers only the basic primary education and simply doesn't have the finances to provide education to many of the rural areas, the children at Hogar Enmanuel are blessed to have the opportunity to attend private institutions that have stepped in to help. The schools are chosen in areas that are safe and in close proximity to the home because we



also must provide transportation to/from school each day. Academics as well as vocational training such as beauty school, cooking school, welding, hotel management, and business are offered to each of our students.

In addition there are tons of activities each month to create special learning experiences. Below are a few:

For instance, Lisby and Alvaro both grew up at Hogar Enmanuel and are now working and the parents of a beautiful baby girl. They both spent an afternoon sharing their experiences of life after leaving the hogar with our teenagers to encourage them to take every advantage of the opportunities afforded them here.

The Agricultural Engineer of *Cepudo* is teaching gardening skills. The children recently harvested their first crop of sugar cane.

Taking a tour of the *Agua Azul* plant taught them about the water purification process.

The younger children learned while they exploring through *Campisa*, a nature park in San Pedro Sula.

Our children visited the *Honduran Air Force,* in La Lima, Cortes

The **Department of Social Work** visited with the children several times with educational videos and workshops to help the children learn about several important topics such as children's rights. self esteem, etc.
