The Lord said to Ananias, "Go! This man (Paul) is my chosen instrument to carry my name before the Gentiles and their kings and before the people of Israel." - Acts 9:15

In April of this year, the Shenandoah and Virlina Districts of the Church of the Brethren shared in an event entitled "Calling the Called!" Its focus was upon the need for the Church to discern and call forth those persons among us whom the LORD may be calling to set-apart ministry.

Within the life of the Church we have always looked at a call to ministry as having two elements - a person himself senses the Lord's call while the Church as the Body of Christ also senses that call. You really can't have one without the other. Looking at the Apostle Paul's call to ministry, the Lord chose Paul, but He used the Church (in the person of Ananias) to convey the call.

The fact that God uses the Church as a vehicle of His call to individual believers is an important thing to note. Knowing this to be the case, we are led to the understanding that there is a need for us to purposefully try to discern who God may be calling to ministry. We might say that "there is a <u>call</u> for us to call out the called."

In the Church of the Brethren we do not look at ministerial leaders as "Clergy" set off in distinction from the "Laity." We speak of the "priesthood of all believers" and also of how God sets some apart for leadership roles. In other words, we believe that every Christian is called to ministry for the LORD. But we also recognize that some members of the Church are chosen by God for special roles of teaching and leadership in the congregation. The question is: How do we discern who those leaders are? How do we "call the called"?

The first place to start is to simply recognize the need to prayerfully be engaged in such discernment. Numbers of folks have recently remarked that perhaps one of the reasons we have so few people available to offer pastoral leadership to our churches is that churches have stopped "calling the called." In other worlds, we have not been putting much thought or effort into the work of spiritually discerning who it is that God would desire to raise up to lead us.

The need is great. The Billy Graham Association says that in the United States 1500 pastors leave the ministry every month. There is a need for us to pray to the Lord that He might reveal to us who in our congregations may have the call of God upon their lives.

God is faithful. He will raise up leaders for His Church. But He does use us in that process. May we ponder anew how we ourselves might be more faithful in seeking to discern new leaders among us. Let's work at "calling the called."

AbbsTract June 2018

"And what is so rare as a day in June?
Then, if ever, come perfect days;
Then Heaven tries the earth if it be in tune,
And over it softly her warm ear lays..."

This is the start to one of my favorite poems, written by James Russell Lowell in the 1800s. It's a lovely poem that speaks of God's generosity in nature for this season – the sights, sounds, smells and colors of late spring/early summer.

(Look it up when you get a chance.)

When I consider the generous nature of God, I am necessarily moved to consider my own generosity. I confess it isn't always what it should be. Maybe you're willing to ponder this with me. Don't worry, I'm not trotting out another formula for tithing or a new campaign for "stewardship," which has become synonymous with "just give us your money."

Where pure generosity is concerned, money is a secondary concept; it is simply a means to an end. The truly generous person has very little thought for money at all!

We've heard so much about "giving the 10% that God requires," and "fulfilling our duty to the Church," and "being responsible tithers" that it's no wonder we have very little joy and generosity when the basket comes around. What God intended to be a spiritual exercise has been turned into an anxious chore in many cases. Is it enough? Is it too much? Did I do the math right? What will the ushers think? God knows we're saving up for vacation. I put extra in last week because I didn't have change for a twenty. We gave to Camp Harmony last month; that counts, right? Wait, did my spouse just put cash in, too? We didn't talk about that beforehand.

There is a word I learned today: munificent. (It's kind of like "magnificent."). Munificent means, "unusually generous." Someone who is munificent gives beyond what is expected, even to the extreme. A munificent person has open hands, a big heart and a bounteous spirit, all of which give freely and unsparingly.

Does that sound like you? I must admit, I have a long way to go with this one.

Yet, when I look at our God, munificence is what I see. When I meet Jesus, He is all generosity, arms stretched wide. When I experience the Holy Spirit, He does not leave me lacking.

As Christians living in the New Covenant, we are not mandated to calculate ten percent of our income. Instead, we are invited to give joyfully, to a ridiculous degree. We're given the chance to be generous beyond what's sensible. Not because we have so much money, but because we serve an amazing God.

What stands in the way of true generosity? Greed. Pride. Fear. Three things we need to put to death. Three things Christ gave His life to erase from our lives.

Take a few minutes to grab your Bible and read 2 Corinthians 8:1-15. Paul wrote about the people in the Macedonian churches. Their wallets were slim, but their generosity was outstanding! Munificent, even! They did not give out of wealth, but out of poverty and with joy, because of the work God was doing in them.

I know we have some munificent people in our district. Several faces spring to mind! There's nothing particularly special about these people, apart from their love for God and their lack of greed, pride and fear. Won't you join me in the abundance of June to pray for this condition to spring forth in our own lives?



Global Mission Updates

Global Mission Prayer Guide

India

Praise God for Jay Wittmeyer's recent visit with the Church of North India (CNI). Wittmeyer, executive director of Global Mission and Service, spoke at the commencement ceremony for Gujarat United School of Theology (GUST), of which the Church of the Brethren is a founding member. Wittmeyer also spent time visiting with CNI families and communities.

CNI began in 1970 as a merger of several denominations, including the First District Church of the Brethren in India, which has remained independent of CNI. The Church of the Brethren in the US relates to both CNI and the First District Church of the Brethren in India.

Pray for families of the more than 125 people who died in India's violent dust storms last week. Most of the deaths came from high winds and intense lightning bursts that collapsed houses and walls, with victims buried underneath. In addition to

the deaths, at least 200 people have been injured, electricity is disrupted, and families face loss of livestock. Pray for those who mourn, those who are injured, and those who have lost homes or livelihoods.

Afghanistan

Pray for victims of multiple bombings in Afghanistan a few weeks ago. Two explosions in the capital city of Kabul killed at least 25 people, including 8 journalists and 4 police officers. At least 45 people have been injured. A suicide bomb attack that struck a school in the Kandahar region killed 11 children and injured at least a dozen more. Pray for solace for those who grieve. Pray for healing of body, mind, and soul. Pray for a changing of the hearts that employ violence.

Puerto Rico

Pray for a recovery planning session between Roy Winter, associate executive director of Global Mission and Service and Brethren Disaster Ministries, and the recently appointed recovery team of the Puerto Rico District of the Church of the Brethren. The group will do training and then focus on guidelines and goals for the long-term hurricane recovery program. Pray for wisdom and energy of this group as they serve Puerto Ricans still suffering the effects of last fall's Hurricane Maria

Nigeria

Officials from Ekklesiyar Yan'uwa a Nigeria (EYN, the Church of the Brethren in Nigeria) have shared reports of violent attacks in Maiduguri, a large city in the northeast. At least six people were killed in the suicide bombings. In another violent incident, at least 19 people were killed when gunmen attacked a church in a small village in Nigeria's Benue state last week. Pray that peace may prevail in Nigeria, where people continue to live with the fear and reality of Boko Haram attacks and violent clashes between herdsman and farmers.

Give thanks for the 71st Majalisa, or annual conference, of Ekklesiyar Yan'uwa a Nigeria (EYN, Church of the Brethren in Nigeria), which took place April 10-13 at EYN's headquarters in Kwarhi. The conference theme was "Gathered in His Presence," based on Psalm 15:1. While reports highlighted how many congregations are still struggling due to displacement from Boko Haram violence, it was also joyfully reported that three new districts are being added, and 31 congregations will be granted full autonomy in 2018.

The conference concluded with a soccer game as part of the EYN Gospel Team Presidential Football Tournament.

Global Mission Prayer Guide

South Sudan

Pray for Carolyn and Roger Schrock as they travel to South Sudan for two and a half months of volunteer service with the Brethren Peace Center in Torit. The Schrocks will train agronomists and work with the Eastern Equatoria Farmer's Association, an organization seeking to fight the region's pervasive hunger by encouraging farmers to pool resources and leverage assets. Pray for the Schrocks' health and safety as they serve. Pray for the efforts of all working to ease the hunger crisis in South Sudan.

Pray for Global Mission worker Athanasus Ungang as he travels from South Sudan to the United States for several weeks of home leave with his

family. Pray for a time of rest, relaxation, and refocusing.

Israel and Palestine

Pray for all victims of the immense violence occurring in Gaza and the West Bank. In clashes between Palestinian protesters and the Israeli army on Monday, at least 52 Palestinians were killed and more than 2,400 injured. At least 90 Palestinians have been killed in Gaza by Israeli forces since protests began on March 30. The protests have centered on Israel's economic blockade of Gaza and on Palestinian refugees' right to return. The protests have been leading up to what is known as the Nakba on May 15, the 70th anniversary of the establishment of the state of Israel, which included a violent and forcible expulsion of hundreds of thousands of Palestinians from their villages.

The tensions and violence were exacerbated by the United States government choosing Monday to officially relocate its Israel embassy to Jerusalem, a move that has been condemned by the United States National Council of Churches and much of the international community for its detrimental effect to the peace process in Israel and the Occupied Palestinian Territories.

Pray for those who mourn the loss of loved ones and those who are injured without access to proper medical care. Pray for Israelis living in fear and for Palestinians living with daily oppression. Pray for the safety of those who work for peace and justice, such as the Christian Peacemaker Teams. Pray for an end to Israel's illegal military occupation of Palestine. Pray that all actors -- Palestinian, Israeli, and otherwise -- lay down their weapons and that a just peace may reign.

Dear Friends in the Western District,


