


## MUSEUM OF THE BIBLE



The **Geiger COB** is planning to honor local heroes of their community.







*What does it mean to lead in today's church and world? The American protestant church is in steep decline. The Church of the Brethren is experiencing schism. The pandemic accelerated the already changing patterns of religious life. Resources are scarce. Furthermore, Brethren are naturally suspicious of leaders; called, elected, or self-proclaimed. Values, such as humility, consensus, and the priesthood of all believers, lead to a flat hierarchy and a communal pragmatism. We celebrate leaders such as Dan West, Sarah Major, M.R. Zigler, and Anna Mow, but in their day, they stirred controversy by the manner of their leading. So, what does it mean to lead in today's church and world? I believe leadership begins by asking the first question and having the willingness and curiosity to pursue the second question. It is a way of thinking that results in effective doing. And yes, it is something we do together.*

Prayers of thanks are requested for the Brethren Disaster Ministries grant to the DR church, which enabled churches in the southern part of the island to provide three days of food for more than a thousand Haitian people who are sheltering in that area (photo). Pray for peace in Haiti and for the Haitian brothers and sisters both in Haiti and in the DR. Pray for the spiritual life of all the leaders and members of Iglesia de los Hermanos Republica Dominicana (the Church of the Brethren in the Dominican Republic) and of Comunidad de Fe (Community of Faith), the sector of the Church of the Brethren in the DR that is made up of Kreyol-speaking congregations of people of Haitian heritage.



### Nigeria

On April 14, Ekklesiyar Yan'uwa a Nigeria (EYN, the Church of the Brethren in Nigeria), saw the [10th anniversary of the Boko Haram kidnapping](#) of 276 girls from a school in Chibok, the majority of whom were from EYN families. Eighty-two (82) of them have not yet returned, and some who have come back have struggled to recover and resume normal daily life. The kidnapping of children, women, and men for ransom has continued over the decade and has been increasing, including hundreds of people taken from various locations in early April. We praise God for the successful conclusion of the EYN Majalisa on April 19, and for the election of

new leaders at that gathering. Let's continue to pray for God to increase their grace and wisdom as they carry out the work of the church. The newly elected leaders are Rev. Dr. Daniel Y.C. Mbaya as president, Rev. Nuhu Mutah Abba as vice president. Rev. James K. Musa as general secretary, Rev. Luka Timta Musa as administrative secretary, and Bitrus Y. Duwara was appointed as the new director of Disaster Relief Management. We rejoice in the freedom regained by Mr. Hamman Bassi, who was kidnapped by Boko Haram in December 2023. Glory to God! Your prayers for his release are deeply appreciated.

### Democratic Republic of Congo

Pray that the construction of the headquarters building of l'Eglise des Frères au Congo (the Church of the Brethren in DR Congo) continues without setbacks and will result in a usable building soon. There has been flooding (pictured, above) due to the rising waters of Lake Tanganyika, causing much property damage and the subsequent displacement of people from their homes. Pray the waters will recede, buildings will be repaired, and people will return to their homes and communities. Pray, too, for the restoration of peace in the eastern part of the Democratic Republic of Congo.

## Global Mission Prayer Guide

### Uganda

Join the Church of the Brethren in Uganda as they offer prayers of praise and thanksgiving for: Two acres of land recently purchased and the ongoing construction of semi-permanent buildings so that the Rising Star Orphanage and Junior School can begin operating soon. Vocational training led by Marla Abe at the national church headquarters in Kampala and the Calvary Life Church of the Brethren in Hima in early April. The participants grew in their understanding of sustainable



agriculture and carpentry production practices, skills which are vital for their increasing self-dependence and financial stability. Pray for the Uganda church, that: Church leadership will always be sensitive to the leading of the Holy Spirit in all aspects of ministry. An evangelistic spirit will continue to pervade the church members and they will continue to see clearly and respond to opportunities to build relationships and share the message of Jesus. The projects of the church, including agriculture, chicken-keeping, bee-keeping, and grain milling, will flourish. Managers who are entrusted with the oversight of these projects will be faithful and fulfill all business obligations in a timely way. Special needs of the church will be met, especially in land purchases, buildings, and vehicles. Pray that a taxi and/or motorcycles will be obtained for pastors whose churches are far from their homes. Weather across Uganda will return to a normal state and stabilize, resulting in just enough rain and sun to enable crops to grow well. Pray that bad weather will not damage or destroy infrastructure.


### Brazil

Many of the members and friends of Igreja da Irmandade (the Church of the Brethren in Brazil) are experiencing illness, and even with adequate treatments face health difficulties that require attention. Pray for the health of the church members. Brazil continues to face a severe pandemic of dengue, zika, and chikungunya infections. More than two million people have been infected. There are not enough vaccines available for everyone, and there are more than 1,500 deaths predicted during the current outbreak. Pray for this health crisis to be brought under control. In March, the southern part of Brazil experienced severe storms as a result of continuing climate change. Thousands of people have had to abandon their homes because of flooding and landslides. Pray for them, that they may find safe and stable housing, and that the weather conditions may improve. Marcos Inhauser, secretary of the national church, has non-metastasizing nose cancer. He will begin receiving radiation therapy in the next few days. Prayers for his healing are requested. The church continues renovation of its recently purchased property. The work is proceeding according to plan, but no date has yet been set for the dedication. Pray for a safe completion of the work.

### Kenya and Tanzania (*Churches planted by the Church of the Brethren in Burundi*)

Pray for Pastor Richard and family and Pastor Anthony and his wife, Miriam, who provide servant leadership in two congregations near the city of Thika, Kenya, about an hour north of the capital city Nairobi. They have begun several prayer cells that serve as development points to identify potential locations for new churches. Pray that the Lord provides these pastors and families with their daily needs.

Pray for the Kisii Church of the Brethren in Kenya, especially for the children whose parents alone do not have sufficient resources to feed, house, and nurture them. Because of the faith community's mission of helping children grow and thrive in whatever ways they can, these families receive support. Celebrate the first baptism service held by the church in Tanzania, on April 8. Seven believers went into the waters of Lake Victoria for triune immersion by Pastor Rhobinson Saleh, praise be to God. Pray for the pastors and new churches in the several growing and new churches in Africa, that the pastoral training their leaders need and want may become available to educate and support them.


