It was Palm Sunday morning. The children of the congregation were ready to present their program. Pastor Abby prepared those in the pews: “Take your right hand and reach up, actually do this, and take hold of your seat buckle. Now pull it down and across and latch it into place. Now, hold on, because the kids are coming in with lots of energy, so get ready for their joy!”

And they did have lots of energy and joy! They came into the sanctuary dancing to “Church Clap” and the next twenty or so minutes were filled with jumping, clapping, singing children! Nearly twenty of them proclaimed the good news of the resurrection of Jesus, the Christ! What a wonderful celebration of life it was! Such beautiful words of hope had been planted into their young minds during the preceding weeks of practice and learning! Their enthusiasm was contagious and those sitting in the pews could hardly sit still!

It reminded me of another Palm Sunday, 2000 years ago. Matthew (21) tells us that the children were shouting in the temple complex “Hosanna to the Son of David!” No doubt these were jumping, clapping and singing children. While temple leaders criticized the noisy children, Jesus accepted their exuberant praises!

We are entering the months of summer when children are out of school and Bible School often takes place in our churches. I encourage you to get involved in this great ministry to children. Help in whatever way you can. No children in your church? Invite the children of the community in. Use the time to get to know them and their parents as they get to know Jesus. Not enough people to host a Bible School? Partner with another church in the community, work together to have a dynamic time.

Or you can contact **Child Evangelism Fellowship**: you provide the space and they provide the volunteers. Five times in one week too much? Spread your events out to once a week, once a month or even once a summer. Do whatever works to minister to children and teach them about Jesus!

The challenge is to not look at what we cannot do but instead, let’s look for what we **can** do!!! Especially when it comes to proclaiming our faith and passing on that faith to the next generation, let’s look at what we **can** do – together!!!







From the barrage of social media platforms to website presence to electronic communications enabled by computers and smartphones to a 24/7 cultural expectation of availability, the shape and landscape of ministerial leadership have needed to shift to thoughtfully incorporate these tools into one's ministry practices. In this daylong workshop, we will address several key concepts and questions related to the use of tech tools in one's ministry. For instance, in this new digital age, how can one ensure that the practices of ministry remain grounded in the core principles of pastoral care and discipleship? How does the ministerial leader carefully live into a high-touch ministry that utilizes high-tech gadgets? What is the role of the ministerial leader in reminding communities of faith about healthy boundaries in the building of community that furthers the life of discipleship through electronic platforms and social media? How does the ministerial leader maintain healthy Sabbath practices in a 24/7 connected world? Time frame for the Session

Presentation (minimum 5 hours) using the materials entitled “Ethics for the Set-Apart Minister” authored by James Benedict published by the Office of Ministry along with new addendum compiled by additional Brethren authors.

Instruction, Bible study, and small group activities will focus on the skills of ethical analysis and practice applying these to both biblical narratives and contemporary “cases” and identifying factors that contribute to ethical vulnerability and ethical resilience. The Addendum explores the themes of artificial intelligence, use of social media, and intercultural competency related to ministerial ethics.

Meal on their own (1 ½ hours)

Presentation (minimum 1 hour) of the 2008 Annual Conference document, *Ethics in Ministry Relations*; to be led by a district executive.
