

FROM THE DISTRICT MINISTER

One of the greatest needs in the current life of the Church is for pastoral and congregational leadership. There are many churches looking for pastoral leadership and so few pastors to take up those calls. We know how throughout the Bible God raised up leaders for His people and for His purposes – for example, Moses, Joshua, Deborah, Samuel, David, Josiah, Daniel, Esther, Peter, Stephen, Paul, Timothy, and Priscilla and Aquila. The same has been true through the history of the Church over the centuries. But right now, in the churches of the United States, there is a great need for God's people to call out new leaders for the Church.

To help address this need, the Pennsylvania and Maryland districts of the Church of the Brethren are sponsoring an event named "Calling the Called." This event is aimed at helping churches and individuals sense God's leading as He would raise up new pastors and leaders for the churches. This event will involve two parts - the first being a ZOOM meeting on May 1, 2021 and then a follow-up, in-person, gathering on September 25, 2021 at the Chambersburg Church of the Brethren. This "Calling the Called" effort is intended to be an exploratory time and is designed to encourage and assist those who may be experiencing the call of God on their lives for ministry. Calling people to ministry is one of the most important things congregations can do. Congregations are the lifeblood and source of leadership for generations to come.



Trends indicate that more and more congregations are looking within to train and equip future leaders.





Of all the tasks and functions that we do together, we believe the call and development of leadership is a critical priority. Healthy, committed, and creative leadership is vital for growing congregations.



The Part-Time Pastor; Full-Time Church program is a grant-funded initiative through the Church of the Brethren Office of Ministry designed to offer support and encouragement specifically for multivocational pastors. Pastors who participate are paired with a regionally based "Circuit Rider," a minister with gifts of deep listening and encouragement. Circuit Riders come alongside pastors to listen to their joys and challenges and then help to connect them with resources that will be helpful in their particular situation. The program also offers opportunities to connect with other pastors who enjoy the joys and face the challenges of multivocational ministry.



Any Church of the Brethren congregational pastor who serves in a role that is either less-than full-time or less-than fully-compensated is eligible to participate. In our denomination, 77% of all pastors are multivocational, so if you're wondering if you or your pastor are eligible, the answer is very likely "yes"!

ANNUAL CONFERENCE PIVOTS FROM HYBRID TO ONLINE EVENT IN 2021

The Program and Arrangements Committee has determined that the 2021 Annual Conference will be entirely online. The committee hoped to have a hybrid (both in-person and online) Conference as announced last fall.

However, due to the continuing challenges of COVID-19, the committee deemed that it is not wise to have an inperson component for Annual Conference this summer. As the Program and Arrangements Committee has consistently stressed, the health and safety of Annual Conference participants is the highest priority.

This was a difficult decision to make since last summer's Annual Conference needed to be cancelled entirely because of COVID-19. While we know that meeting in person eventually will be safe again, we sadly do not believe that it will happen in time to safely have an in-person event at the end of June 2021.

This will be the first time that the Church of the Brethren Annual Conference has gathered entirely online, as many of our congregations have been doing these past 10 months. While we lament that we cannot be together in person to hug one another, sing together, and eat at tables together, we are nevertheless excited about the new opportunities an online gathering offers. We will be able to open Annual Conference to much greater participation than ever before. Instead of traveling long distances and having only 2,000 or so Brethren gathered together, we are throwing wide the doors to thousands of Brethren who never before have been able to participate fully in Annual Conference.

Imagine an opportunity for many people from each one of our congregations to participate in the virtual opportunities that will be included in the 2021 Annual Conference, gaining tools and resources for their congregations' ministries, benefiting from leadership development, earning continuing education credits, participating in spiritual growth, and networking with other Brethren who share similar ministries and interests.



A one-time, reduced price for non-delegate adults to register for the online Annual Conference is being offered for only \$99. That fee will support the ministry and on-going expenses of Annual Conference and will give non-delegates access to:

- --all six business sessions;
- --all Insight and Equipping Sessions;
- --all networking events;

--a virtual concert by Fernando Ortega. Ortega is a multi-Dove award winner and singer-songwriter whose hits include "This Good Day" and "Jesus, King of Angels";

--resource sessions led by Tod Bolsinger, best-selling author of *Canoeing the Mountains: Christian Leadership in Uncharted Territory*. Bolsinger is the vice president and chief of leadership formation at Fuller Seminary in Pasadena, CA.

--daily Bible studies, along with Insight Sessions, led by Michael Gorman, author of more than 20 books on biblical theology. Gorman is the Raymond E. Brown Chair in Biblical Studies and Theology at St. Mary's Seminary and University in Baltimore, MD, and a frequent lecturer at church and clergy gatherings.

Note: All five worship services will be available free of charge to everyone.

Delegate fees will remain at \$305 and includes access to all of the above in addition to the right to vote during the business sessions and participation in virtual "table talk" discussions of the proposed compelling vision for the Church of the Brethren. Delegates will need to have access to a computer or mobile device with Internet connectivity and sufficient computer skills to participate in an online event.

Haiti

Pray for current unrest in Haiti, there are demonstrations in the street and lockdowns in the capital of Port-au-Prince. Continue to pray for Haiti Medical Project workers as travel is impacted and for the whole Eglise des Freres (Church of the Brethren in Haiti).

India

Praise God that churches in the First District Church of the Brethren in India are meeting (with social distancing guidelines) and that children's Sunday school materials were written this last year. Pray for their annual conference, which will be held in February; the health of one of their elders; and that the COVID-19 vaccine rollout will reach the rural church communities.

Uganda

Prayers requested for 2021 include support for churches with poorer members, land for the churches in Kampala, continued support and school fees for the 76 orphans at Rising Star Orphanage, and the success of some new agriculture projects designed to generate income.

United States

Pray for our country. Pray for the district executives as they held their yearly meeting and the lead the Districts through the year to come.

Nigeria

Praise for the escape/rescue of several of the Chibok girls, nearly seven years after they were abducted by Boko Haram in April 2014. Continued prayers for Ekklesiyar Yan'uwa a Nigeria (EYN, the Church of the Brethren in Nigeria), the areas that are still experiencing violence, and the ongoing fear this causes.
