



ADVANCE RESERVATIONS

The table decorators (hosts) are responsible to sell seats and collect the money for those at your table. All seats should be purchased with pre-sale reservations as we are expecting a sale-out crowd. (Please see attached reservation sheet.) We will not use tickets, but check the paid reservations at the door for a will call. The cost is \$35 per person. A portion of this cost is considered a donation and is tax-deductible. A receipt will be available for the donation portion on the night of the event for those needing them. Additional donations are WELCOME!!!!!

BASKET FOR SILENT AUCTION

In order to raise as much money as possible for the children of Hogar Enmanual, we encourage each table-decorating team to also provide a basket to be used in a silent auction to help offset the costs of the night. This doesn't have to be your expense ---- Solicit local businesses to donate things for your basket! If you have enough donated gifts to create more than one basket, we certainly won't turn anything down. The baskets do not need to be based on any specific theme.

TABLE DECORATING

SET UP: Faith Hall will be open on Friday, April 8th from 10 am to 8 pm. and on Saturday, April 9th from 10 am to 4:00 pm

The tables will be marked indicating which are yours to decorate. All tables should have their final decorating done before 4:00 pm on Saturday so that pictures can be taken of the tables.

• There will be an 8-foot rectangular table for each eight guests (\$280). Two pushed together for 16 (\$560), or three for 24 (840). It is okay if your table isn't 100% full, but please try to sell all your seats.

NEEDED FOR EACH TABLE:

- TABLE COVERING
- NAPKINS -- for each place setting. No paper plates. Plates provided will be used to serve the food.
- DECORATIONS: Decorate the center of the table, leaving space for the plates of food to be served.
 - If your decorations might obstruct other's view of the stage, your table will be in the back or side of the hall.
 - Please make sure any sand or glitter that is used is contained for easy clean-up.
 - If using candles, please use flameless, battery-operated ones. No electricity is provided at the tables.
 - Boxes used to transport your decorations can be stored in the other dining hall until after the event
- FAVOR -- for each place setting (this can be something other than a dessert as desserts will be provided.)
- SERVERS -- Two people that can help serve the dinner plates prepared by Camp Staff while the food is still piping hot to those sitting at your table.
- <u>Plates, silverware, drinking glasses, and coffee cups are provided</u> and will be available in the hall for you to pick up and put at each of your place settings when you decorate your table.

CLEAN UP

• Each team is asked to help provide clean-up. All decorations must be removed; chairs and tables taken down at the end of the program.

ARCHIVAL INTERN OPENING

Brethren Historical Library and Archives Church of the Brethren



Archival Internship Program: The purpose of the program is to develop interest in vocations related to archives and libraries and/or Brethren history. The program will provide the intern with work assignments in the Brethren Historical Library and Archives (BHLA) and with opportunities to develop professional contacts.

Work assignments will include processing archival materials, writing descriptive inventories, preparing books for cataloging, responding to reference requests, and assisting researchers in the library. Professional contacts may include attending archival and library conferences and workshops, visits to libraries and archives in the Chicago area, and participation in a Brethren Historical Committee meeting (pending on COVID-19 restrictions).

Brethren Historical Library and Archives: BHLA is the official repository for Church of the Brethren publications and records. The collection consists of over 10,000 volumes, over 3500 linear feet of manuscripts and records, over 40,000 photographs, plus videos, films, DVDs, and recordings. BHLA is located at the Church of the Brethren General Offices in Elgin, Illinois.

Term of Service: One Year, beginning July 2022 (preferred)

Compensation: Housing, stipend of \$550 every two weeks, health insurance.


Annual Conference 2022 July 10-14 (Sunday-Thursday)

Online registration for the 2022 Church of the Brethren Annual Conference taking place in Omaha, Nebraska, on July 10-14 will open on **March 1 at 12 noon central time / 1 p.m. Eastern time.** Online registration will be available for both delegates and non-delegates at the Annual Conference website www.brethren.org/ac2022.

The advance delegate registration fee is \$310 per delegate.

Advance registration will close on June 10. The fee for registering delegates onsite in Omaha will be \$385. Don't wait!



The advance nondelegate registration fee is \$130. Advance registration will close on June 10. The fee for registering nondelegates onsite in Omaha will be \$165.

There also will be an option to register as a virtual nondelegate to watch business online, view special events and concerts, and participate in a number of equipping sessions. Information will be shared on the Annual Conference website.

Delegates must be full members of the Church of the Brethren. The number of delegates for each congregation is based on the membership statistics as reported in the 2021 Church of the Brethren Yearbook. The number allowed is as follows:

up to 200 members: 1 delegate

— 201 to 400 members: 2 delegates

— 401 to 600 members: 3 delegates

— 601 to 800 members: 4 delegates

There are two hotels in the Conference block: Hilton Omaha at \$106 per night (plus tax) and Doubletree by Hilton Omaha at \$106 per night (plus tax). This is the lowest hotel rate the Conference has enjoyed since 2009. Please go to www.brethren.org/ac2022/hotels for more hotel information.
