We have recently celebrated how Jesus was raised from death on Easter morn. We learn from the Book of Acts that after Jesus' resurrection, he appeared to his disciples over a 40 days' period of time. Then he ascended into heaven and was seated at the right hand of God the Father in glory.

"God has raised this Jesus to life, and we are witnesses of the fact. Exalted to the right hand of God, he has received from the Father the promised Holy Spirit and has poured out what you now see and hear."

- Acts 2:32-22

But Jesus remained active in the lives of his disciples

in that soon after his ascension he poured out the promised Holy Spirit upon them. With reference to this, one author in a recent book has called Jesus "The Spirit Baptizer." The idea here is that a major part of Jesus' work in our lives is that he baptizes us with the Holy Spirit. I have always been fascinated by how the New Testament sees our receiving the gift of the Holy Spirit as a significant part of what it means to be saved. "Repent and be baptized, every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ, for the forgiveness of sins. And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit" (Acts 2:38).

It is important to know that the forgiveness of our sins is not the only part of salvation. Being baptized by Jesus with the Holy Spirit is all part of it too. We are forgiven, but by the Spirit we go on to live for Christ in power and love. In other words, being a Christian is not simply about being someone whose sins have been forgiven by the Lord. It also means that we have come alive in the Spirit as Jesus has poured out this gift upon us.

I don't think we teach this with the emphasis that it deserves. I think that we have taught only half of what salvation truly involves. Christ is indeed the one who saves us from our sins, but he is also the "Spirit Baptizer," the one who anoints us with the Spirit of our Heavenly Father. It is by the Spirit that we call out to God "Abba, Father." It is by the Spirit that we live the new life of Christ. It is by the power of the Spirit that we bear witness to Jesus, sharing the good news with others.

Understanding this <u>second half</u> of what it means to be saved, if I can put it that way, is very important with regard to truly living the Christian life. Too few Christians understand that if they have called upon the Lord to be saved, He has given them his Holy Spirit. Many Christians seem not to understand the Spirit, thinking that the Spirit is an "it" rather than understanding that the Spirit is "He," the third person of the Trinity, who is poured out upon us unto new life.

Are you aware of the gift of the Spirit that God has given you? Do you know that you have been anointed with the Holy Spirit, the third person of the Trinity? Do you recognize what this means for your living of the Christian life? May our prayer be: "Jesus, I rejoice in the baptism of the Spirit, and I desire to live in the fullness of that baptism. Indeed may it be so, Lord. Amen!"



Bus Trip to the International Civil Rights Center and Museum

Annual Conference is arranging a bus trip tour to the International Civil Rights Center and Museum in downtown Greensboro on Thursday July 4, 2019. This trip is for Non-delegates only since it takes place during a business session. The bus leaves at 8:45 a.m. and returns at 11:30 a.m.



The International Civil Rights Center and Museum is an archival center, collecting museum, and teaching facility devoted to the international struggle for civil and human rights. The Museum celebrates the nonviolent protests of the 1960 Greensboro sit-ins that served as a catalyst in the civil rights movement.

The museum is housed in the original F.W. Woolworth building where the "Greensboro Four" sit-in movement began. The guided tour showcases

numerous films, enactments, interactive displays, live narration, and civil rights artifacts that include the original lunch counter where the sit-in occurred.

Tickets are \$17 per adult, which includes museum admission and bus. Tickets may be purchased online when you register online for Annual Conference. Seating is very limited and tickets may not be available onsite in Greensboro. To

Global Mission Updates

Global Mission Prayer Guide

Nigeria

Pray for the Majalisa or annual conference of Ekklesiyar Yan'uwa a Nigeria (EYN, Church of the Brethren in Nigeria) happening this week. As many EYN members face increasing risks of violence, pray that Majalisa participants are filled with hope and strength through experiences of fellowship, discernment, and worship. Pray for Jay Wittmeyer, executive director of Global Mission and Service, as he attends the Majalisa and meets with EYN leaders. He is the main preacher for the conference. April 14 marks the 50th anniversary of the abductions of 276 young women, many of whom were members of Ekklesiyar Yan'uwa a Nigeria (EYN, the Church of the Brethren in Nigeria), from their school in Chibok. Many of the young women have returned, but more than 100 are still missing. EYN partners believe that several of the women have died from bombings, snakebites, and childbirth complications. Hundreds more people have been victims of Boko Harm abductions in recent years. Pray for God's preservation of all those who remain in captivity. Pray that they may be granted release and relief. Pray for the families of those who are missing and those who have died.

May God surround them with comfort and strength.

Praise God for the growth being celebrated by Iglesia de los
Hermanos-Una Luz en las Naciones (the Church of the Brethren in
Spain). Independent congregations in the cities of Bilbao and
Madrid joined the Church of the Brethren after their pastors

The celebration of this ordinance follows a time of congregational training and discussion of Brethren beliefs and practices, as detailed in the book by Galen Hackman. The inaugural Rwandan love feast took place on Palm Sunday for the Mudende and Humure congregations. The Gisenyi and Gasiza congregations will celebrate love feast on Easter Sunday. Pray for the Rwandan Brethren as they continue to seek the ways of peace, simplicity, and community following in the footsteps of Jesus.


