DISTRICT UPDATE

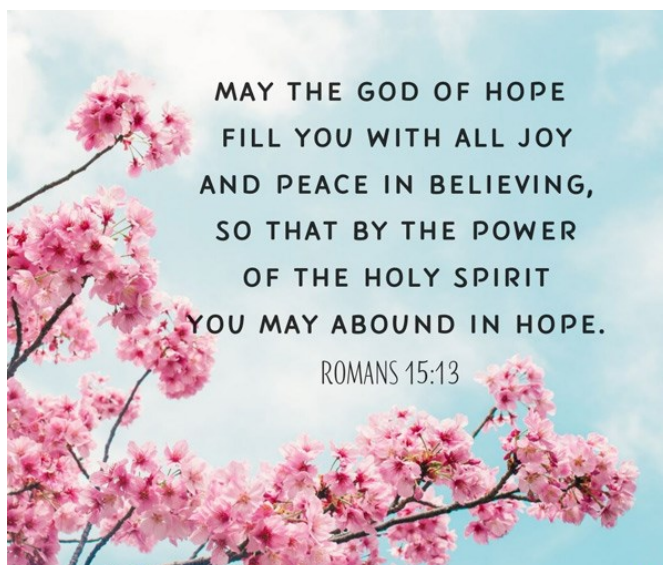
Greetings to everyone!

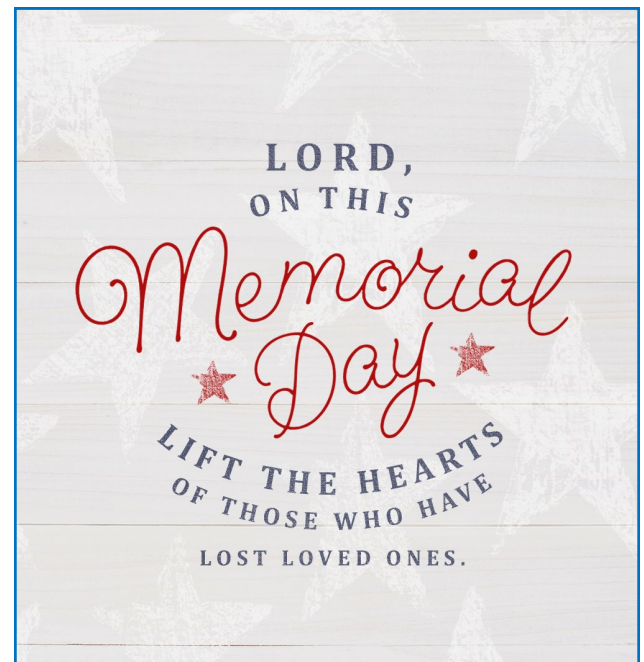

Global Mission releases list of grants made to international partners in 2021

Global Mission co-executives Eric Miller and Ruoxia Li have announced the grants their office distributed to international partners last year, in 2021. Close to \$700,000 was distributed, made possible through donations to the mission work of the Church of the Brethren denomination. Norm and Carol Spicher Waggy, who previously served as interim directors of Global Mission, contributed to the work of identifying grant recipients.

The grants represent financial support from Global Mission and partner groups to the administrative budgets of emerging Churches of the Brethren in a variety of countries, as well as efforts such as church building and health care, among others.

Significant financial support for the grants came from Brethren World Mission and the Brethren Mission Fund. The Royer Foundation contributed a significant amount for the Haiti Medical Project, and Paul and Sandy Brubaker did work to raise funds for that project. The Global Mission office also received and distributed funds on behalf of the Global Women's Project. →→→

These amounts do not include grants from the Global Food Initiative (GFI) or from the Emergency Disaster Fund (EDF) as directed by Brethren Disaster Ministries staff.

The 2021 grants distributed by Global Mission, listed alphabetically by country:

Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC): \$10,000 in financial support to the administrative budget of the Church of the Brethren in the DRC.

Dominican Republic (DR): \$22,000 in financial support to the administrative budget of the Church of the Brethren in the DR, including some expenses for meetings and travel.

Haiti: A total of \$478,131 includes grants to the Haiti Medical Project, \$80,000 for the purchase of property for the Delmas Church, and \$35,000 for the church basement/building in Saut-Mathurine.

Honduras: \$500 for theological training.

India: \$2,000 in financial support to the administrative budget of First District Church of the Brethren in India.

Mexico: \$250 for program supplies.

Nigeria: \$41,214 mostly for rebuilding churches of Ekklesiyar Yan'uwa a Nigeria (EYN, the Church of the Brethren in Nigeria) that have been destroyed in violence.

Rwanda: \$57,857 for the building of church headquarters, scholarships for Twa students, and seminary training for pastors.

South Sudan: \$36,000 for regular mission programming including agriculture, trauma healing, and reconciliation efforts.

Spain: \$19,706 including theological training for leaders of the Church of the Brethren in Spain.

Uganda: \$6,410 including funding for a Christmas event at an orphanage.

Venezuela: \$23,955 including church building and support for the outreach to indigenous peoples by the Church of the Brethren in Venezuela.

COB CONFERENCES

Annual Conference 2022 July 10-14



Annual Conference agenda will include one item of unfinished business and seven items of new business

The business items for the Church of the Brethren's Annual Conference on July 10-14 in Omaha, Neb., are now posted online. The Conference is returning to a full business agenda complete with queries and other new business after several years in which the compelling vision took precedence.

The Conference will address one item of unfinished business, "Update to Polity Regarding Annual Conference Agencies," and seven items of new business.

New business includes queries on "Standing with People of Color" and "Breaking Down Barriers-Increasing Access to Denominational Events"; three items related to pay and benefits for pastors: a new Integrated Annual Ministry Agreement and Revised Guidelines for Pastors' Salaries and Benefits, a Revised Minimum Cash Salary Table for Pastors, and the annual cost-of-living adjustment to the Minimum Cash Salary Table for Pastors (the latter recommendation to come in June); amendments to the appeal section of the Ethics in Ministry Relations polity document; and revisions to the denomination's bylaws.

The delegate body also will vote on a ballot and will receive numerous reports including from the denomination's Leadership Team, the work of the Church of the Brethren's board and staff, the Annual Conference agencies (Bethany Seminary, Brethren Benefit Trust, and On Earth Peace), Conference committees including the Program and Arrangements Committee and the Pastoral Compensation and Benefits Advisory Committee, and representatives to ecumenical organizations.

To watch the business online you must register as a virtual nondelegate. Business sessions will no longer be live-streamed free of charge. Go to www.brethren.org/ac2022/registration.

Who is eligible to attend?

Youth who have completed ninth grade through one year of college at the time of NYC (or are age equivalent) and their adult advisors are invited to attend. All youth must be accompanied by an adult advisor. Please send at least one advisor for every five youth. If sending female youth, please send a female advisor and if sending male youth, please send a male advisor. All adult advisors must be a minimum of 22 years of age.

What is the cost?

The \$550 registration fee, for youth and advisors, includes lodging, food, and event programming.

When can I register?

NYC registration is open now! Register before April 1 to avoid a \$50 late fee.

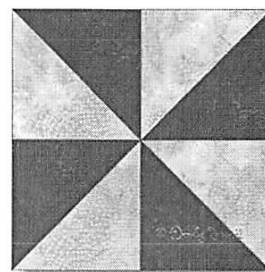

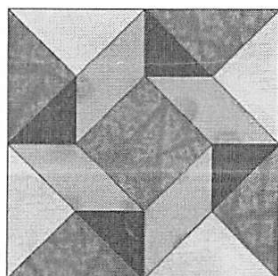
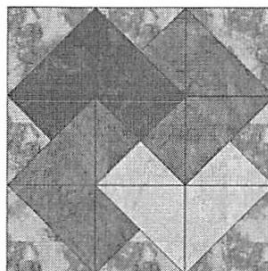

PLEASE FOLLOW THESE INSTRUCTIONS FOR YOUR QUILT BLOCK

TYPE OF FABRIC

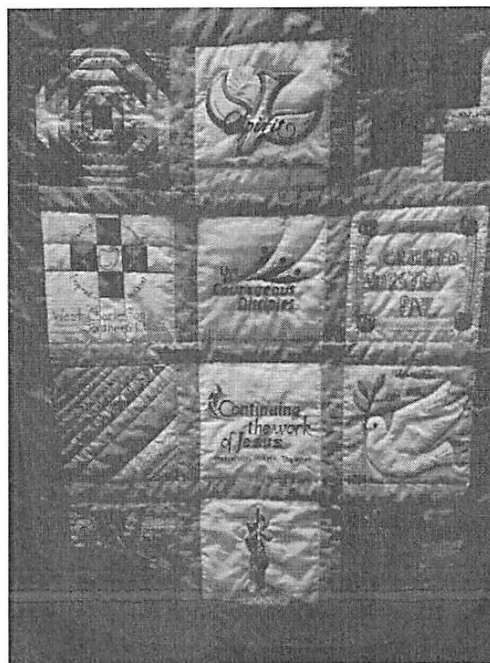
- Pre-shrunk cotton or cotton blend.
- If you use stabilizer,
Please use only water soluble,
very soft or easily removed backing.

Do not use: double knit,
counted cross-stitch on canvas,
liquid embroidery, padded blocks,
or heat-applied designs or photos.

PLEASE: NO GLUE

PATTERN

- Use your own creativity to make your design.
- **Important: Identify your block** with your congregation's name, state, and/or district.
This makes the quilts more valuable!
(Second blocks from your congregation need not be identified.)



SIZE OF BLOCK

- **Outside border:** Not less than 8½ square
AFTER it is worked.
- **Inside design:** Not more than 8" square
with nothing in the seam allowance.

**Cut the block to size AFTER it has been
pieced, embroidered, or appliquéd.**

Accuracy is important.
Blocks less than 8½ inches will not fit;
larger designs will be obscured.

We plan to be at Omaha for conference this
year, but in the event of COVID restrictions,
we will still do wall hangings to be quilted at a
later date. So please, send those blocks!!

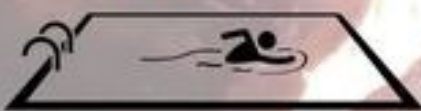
