
chose the theme "If only all the hands that reach could touch" as the theme for this year's District Conference.



ARBUTUS COB PET FOOD PANTRY

The pantry is open the second Saturday of the month from 10:00 am to 12:00 pm. To become a new client the only credential needed is proof of your address. This can be any type of ID such as driver's license or a piece of mail with your name and address.

We collect donations of cat and dog food. If you have an open bag of food that is not needed it can be donated to the pantry. The volunteers repackage the food for the clients. These donations can be dropped off at the Arbutus Church of the Brethren 1201 Erickson Drive in Richland. The first set of doors of the church are open 24/7.

The pantry serves approximately 110 clients per month. Items placed on a free table are offered to the clients. Anything that fits on a table can be donated. We also have pet beds and climbers for cats which go quickly. In November the free table is offers blankets to the clients. Our goal is to collect 100 blankets for this year's table. The shoe committee would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone throughout the district who has taken the time and effort to support our project! On October 9, after many months of collecting and storing shoes, a group of volunteers met at the Westmont church to meet the funds2orgs truck. Most of us wouldn't have been considered young, but with a great group effort, we were able to load 4,225 pairs of shoes onto the truck in about 30 minutes. Just a week later, we received confirmation from funds2orgs office in Florida that our shipment earned \$2,146.50. This is our highest shipment total to date!

We are thrilled to be able to support the work of the El Hogar de Ninos Enmanuel, and are thankful for the support of the district churches and individuals who gather, assemble, and deliver shoes. 




