This past summer's Annual Conference introduced to the Church of the Brethren a *Compelling Vision Process*. The intention of this process is to help the people of the Church of the Brethren find a common vision that will enable us to move forward as we struggle to define a common identity. The Annual Conference delegates began to talk about what it is that keeps us together as a Church, what motivates us to follow Christ, and how do we move forward.

Over the next six months, discussion sessions will be held in all of the districts of the Church of the Brethren so that the people might contribute their ideas as to what this vision ought to be. Then at the 2019 Annual Conference the majority of the time will be spent bringing a focus to the ideas that have been gathered from the members of the Church. A task team will then compose a concise compelling vision statement for the Church to take up for its future life and mission.

The Guiding Statement that has been set forth to frame this discussion is as follows: "Confessing Jesus Christ as Teacher, Redeemer, and Lord, we desire to serve Him by pro-claiming, professing, and walking in His way together bringing His peace to our broken world. Join us in reclaiming a new passion for Christ and helping set a course for our future as the Church of the Brethren serving Him in our communities and in the world!" This guiding statement will set the focus and tone of the overall discussion.

The Western Pennsylvania District will have the opportunity to share in this process during two different Discussion Times that will be led by Kay Weaver from the Atlantic Northeast District. Kay is part of the task team helping to facilitate the vision process. **The first of our Western PA Discussion Times will be held on Sunday, November 4th, at Camp Harmony. This session will begin at 2:30 p.m. and conclude at 5 p.m. The second one will be held on Sunday, November 25th, at Mount Joy Church of the Brethren. This session too will begin at 2:30 p.m. and conclude at 5 p.m.** (Mount Joy's address is 494 E. Main St., Mount Pleasant, PA 15666.) All members of the Western PA congregations are invited to attend one of these sessions. I encourage you to attend. It is important that our ideas be shared and become part of the information funneled into the Compelling Vision. If you have any questions concerning this, please feel welcome to call me at (814)479-2181.




Do you have a passion for leading youth to a life-changing walk with the Lord Jesus Christ? If so, then read on:

As summer gives way to fall, the process launched at the 2018 Annual Conference to help the denomination discern God's call and develop a compelling vision to guide us into the future is moving into a new phase. Shaped by the conversations that took place at Annual Conference, the Compelling Vision Process Team has designed a two-hour event to engage members in deeper conversation around God's call for us as a church.

These conversation events have already taken place in the Southern Plains and Michigan districts, and the Process Team is working with district executives to schedule additional events in multiple locations across the denomination. The next scheduled conversations will take place at the Missouri/Arkansas District conference at the Windemere Conference Center in Roach, Mo., the weekend of Sept. 14-15; at Mount Morris Church of the Brethren in the Illinois/Wisconsin District on Sept. 16 (with two additional events to follow in the district in October); and four locations throughout Southern Pennsylvania District the weekend of Sept. 29-30. Districts will be publicizing all scheduled events as plans are finalized.

Everyone is invited and encouraged to participate in an event. In preparation, please: pray for the church and the Spirit's guidance as we move through this process; visit the <u>Compelling Vision website</u>, and read about the Compelling Vision process (especially if you were not at Annual Conference and are unfamiliar with it); reflect on scriptures that inform our ministry and life together as the body of Christ; and bring a Bible and, if possible, a smart phone, tablet, or laptop to the event.

He gave his life to Jesus Christ at the age of eight at a tent meeting revival at the county fairgrounds, and felt a call to ministry when he was 16. At that time, Tom began preaching in area congregations for special events, youth revivals, and pulpit supply, and was also licensed to the Ministry.



In 1976, Tom graduated from Mt. Vernon Nazarene College with a Bachelor's Degree in Communications and a double minor in Music and New Testament Greek. Tom attended Ashland Theological Seminary and earned the Masters of Divinity Degree in 1979. Throughout the college and seminary years, Tom served on the pastoral staff of three congregations, focusing on youth ministries, music ministries, and visitation.

Tom was introduced to the Church of the Brethren in 1975, and soon felt God's Call to move from the Church of the Nazarene to the Church of the Brethren. The Ordination transfer was completed in 1981. Tom served two pastorates in the Northern Ohio District: North Bend Church of the Brethren (1976-1980) and Mt. Pleasant Church of the Brethren (1982-1991). The Northern Ohio District called Tom to serve as the District Executive in 1991, a position he held for eleven years. In 2002, sensing God's Call to return to the pastorate, Tom was installed as the Pastor of the Ashland Dickey Church of the Brethren, where he is now preparing for retirement at the end of August, 2018. The Dickey congregation has experienced significant growth, both numerically and spiritually. A second worship service was added in 2006, and the first phase of a long range building plan was completed in 2008. The twenty year strategic plan for ministry entitled "Vision For the Future" calls for continued ministry to those who need the love of Jesus Christ - both in the neighboring community and around the world.

Tom is married to **Susan** (Mayfield) Zuercher, and they celebrated their 44th wedding anniversary in 2018. They had three adult children: **Heather** (Zuercher) **Burns**, a widowed mother of three, died on April 14, 2018, after a five year battle with cancer. Heather and her husband, Roger, left behind three wonderful children: Anna, Braden, and Kaleb, who are currently living with Tom and Susan pending guardianship with their aunt and uncle. **Jared Zuercher** is married to Katie (Daugherty) Zuercher, and they have two daughters: Eirelyn and Noella. Jared practices law in the Akron, Ohio area. **Sharla** (Zuercher) **Lechner** is married to Paul Lechner; they have two daughters: Kaliea and Aelan, and will soon have permanent custody of Anna, Braden, and Kaleb. Paul and Sharla are both chemical engineers, but Sharla is developing her career as a stay-at home Mom who home schools.

Because of his passion for and experience with church growth, Tom has served as a consultant for congregations across the country, leading seminars on various church issues. Beyond organizational topics, Tom also has led numerous revivals, retreats and workshops, focusing on spiritual growth and transformation. For eight years (2003-2011) Tom served as Adjunct Faculty at Ashland Theological Seminary, providing leadership in the Masters of Divinity Cohort program. In addition to church ministry, Tom's other interests include foreign travel, United States postage stamps, archaeological history of Jerusalem and the Temple Mount, and the theatre.

Meet Zahid


Nine year old Zahid has been part of the Hogar family since age 4. He was born with a debilatating bone condition on his tibia called pseudarthrosis., which can be defined as a "false joint." This is comparable to a break in the bone that is unable to heal itself.

With the help of the Ruth Paz Foundation, Zahid has had five surgeries in the past 5 years to compensate for the growth and strengthen his tibia. Despite minor complications, the surgeries have been successful and have enabled Zaide to go from a wheelchair to now walking with the help of his crutches.

Zahid's most recent surgery was performed on August 28th. Please pray for complete healing and renewed strength.

The cost of the surgery and doctor's fees have been generously provided for by The Ruth Paz Foundation. However, we at Hogar Enmanuel must purchase the bone graft material that will be used to strengthen Zahid's tibia bone. The cost of the bone material is \$600. 
