



One of the key spiritual realities about the Church is that it is the Body of Christ. Christ is the head of the Church, and we are all members of his body, joined together in His Spirit. A Christian congregation is not simply made up of individual people who have no spiritual bond with one another. As Christ's people, we are in covenant with one another in Him and through Him. This covenant is one of mutual love and submission.

Covenant is a key concept in the Bible. The God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob was in covenant with his people Israel. He bound Himself to them in a pledge of faithfulness and love. Jesus established a new covenant between His heavenly Father and his disciples. This covenant was established through His shed blood. And the covenantal nature of our relationship with each other in the Church is evidenced in Jesus' command to "love one another as I have loved you." The call for us to love each other is bound up in Christ's love for us. In the church, we are not isolated individuals who are free to keep ourselves walled off from the other members of our congregation. We have covenant obligations to one another as taught by Christ.

These mutual obligations are seen in the teachings of the Lord and His apostles.

Below are some of those commands and instructions:

"Honor one another above yourselves." - Romans 12:10

"Be patient, bearing with one another in love." - Ephesians 4:2

"Submit to one another out of reverence for Christ." - Ephesians 5:21

"Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving one another just as in Christ God forgave you." - Ephesians 4:12

"Each of you should look not only to his own interests but also to the interest of others." - Philippians 2:4

"Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace." - Ephesians 4:3

In our day of fractured relationships, quickness to anger, disrespect of other people, and the claiming of a personal right to push to get our own way, the Church can show a different way. We can live out a deeply loving and cooperative lifestyle. But we each must be willing to choose to obey the commands of Jesus as He calls us to live in covenantal fellowship with one another. This is not always easy, but it is right and good. It is the way of Christ.

May the peace of the Lord be with you all!

Brethren Disaster Ministries Hurricane Dorian response

The official annual hurricane season for the Atlantic Basin is from June 1 to November 30 each year. The strongest storm so far of the 2019 season has been Hurricane Dorian, which, at its peak, was a powerful Category 5 storm.



Children's Disaster Services (CDS), a program of Brethren Disaster Ministries (BDM), stood ready to assist where needed once Hurricane Dorian made its impact on the U.S. mainland. In response to disasters, CDS volunteers set up childcare centers and provide a calm, safe and secure presence for children amid the chaos. The American Red Cross requested that CDS deploy two teams to provide childcare in evacuation centers in North Carolina prior to Hurricane Dorian's arrival there. Two additional teams were on stand-by for immediate deployment in South Carolina. As the impact of the storm was thankfully less than expected, the South Carolina teams were not deployed and the North Carolina teams were needed for only a few days. As a domestic program, it is not likely that CDS will be asked to respond in the Bahamas, which bore the brunt of Hurricane Dorian, but stands ready to assist in other ways. BDM monitored Hurricane Dorian's progress as it moved across the southern Atlantic Ocean. The Church of the Brethren does not have a presence in Bahamas, but as news emerged from the islands of the massive destruction, loss of life and displacement of survivors of this massive storm, BDM began identifying possible partners to work with who have a presence in the Bahamas or who are planning emergency response efforts and/or long-term recovery there, including fellow members of the National Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster (NVOAD) and Church World Service (CWS). BDM staff are also seeking to identify ways that BDM and its volunteers can support immediate clean-up and future rebuilding efforts in areas impacted by Dorian in the U.S., in coordination with Church of the Brethren leaders, CWS and other church and local partners. The Church of the Brethren Material Resources warehouse, located at the Brethren Service Center in New Windsor, Md., stands ready to ship CWS hygiene and school kits, clean up buckets and other materials to the areas affected by Hurricane Dorian.

-The boy who needed to conquer fear climbing the climbing wall, and the young adult speaking truth into their life to help them conquer their fear.

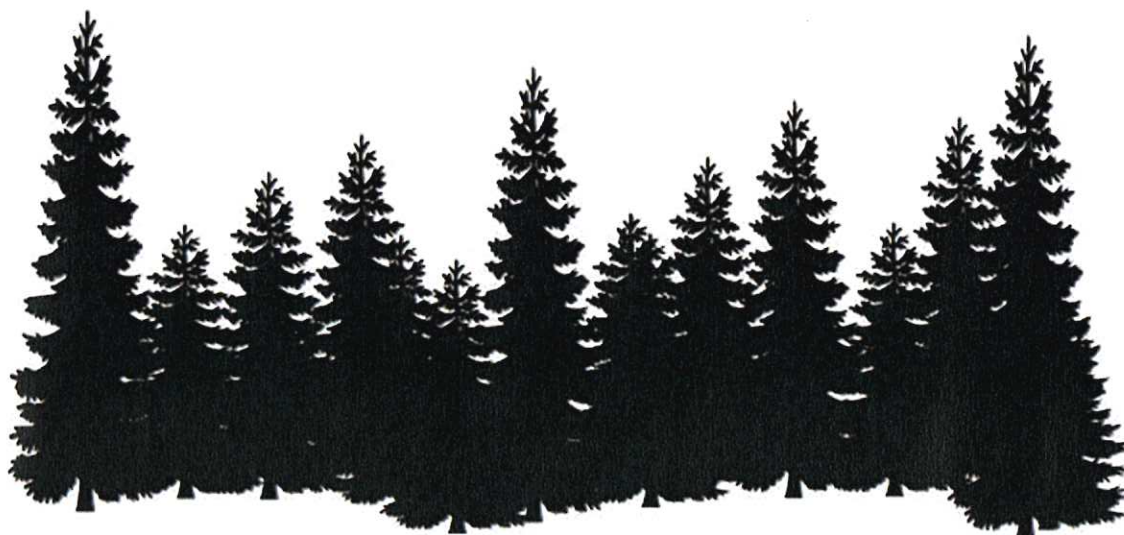

Steve Schweitzer (PhD, Notre Dame) is Academic Dean and Professor at Bethany Theological Seminary. He regularly teaches a graduate seminar on Chronicles-Ezra-Nehemiah and a course on Science Fiction and Theology. Steve has preached, taught, and led workshops for several congregations and districts. Steve and his wife, Jill, have 3 children. They attend Cedar Grove Church of the Brethren in the Southern Ohio/Kentucky District.

Science Fiction is extremely popular in our wider culture. This genre is filled with theological themes: who is God, what does it mean to be human, what is the nature of evil, how is it overcome, is war or violence necessary, to name only a few. Based on a course Steve teaches at Bethany Seminary, examples from widely popular SciFi series – Star Wars, Star Trek, and Doctor Who – that allow connections between theology and culture - will be explored.
