FROM THE DISTRICT MINISTER

REPORT TO THE DISTRICT CONFERENCE 2020

Due to the <u>unprecedented</u> cancelation of the 2020 District Conference because of the COVID-19 pandemic, the following District Conference Business Items were made as Recommendations by the District Core Leadership Team to the District Leadership Team, for actions that were to be taken at the September 12, 2020 meeting at the Plumcreek COB. These actions were taken based on District Constitution Article V Part B (see below), acting on behalf of the District.

ARTICLE V DISTRICT LEADERSHIP TEAM

B. PURPOSE OF THE LEADERSHIP TEAM

The Leadership Team shall manage and administer the work of the District as authorized by District Conference. The Leadership Team shall be the legal agent of the District and shall be empowered to act on behalf of the District Conference ad interim except for those actions specifically reserved for District Conference as set forth in the Constitution and Bylaws.

The following **2020 DISTRICT CONFERENCE BUSINESS ITEMS** were approved by 2/3 vote of the District Leadership Team on September 12, 2020. **These items will be listed in the District Conference Booklet that the congregations will receive by mid-October.**

2020 BUSINESS ITEMS

a. PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE DISTRICT LEADERSHIP TEAM AND RELATED COMMITTEES

Recommendation from the Core Leadership Team to change number of members on each individual team of the District Leadership Team from 5 members to 3 members. This change will take place over the next few years as members complete their terms. These changes are necessary in order to rebuild the District Leadership Team for future service. **APPROVED 9/12/2020**

- **Because of the changes listed above to the Leadership Team and related committee structure, the Gifts Discernment Team has prepared the District Slate utilizing the following format:
 - Outreach and Service Team: 3 members serving one 3-year term with the option to serve a second 3-year term.
 - Pastor and Parish Ministry Team: 3 members serving one 3-year term with the option to serve a second 3-year term.
 - **Spiritual Formation Team:** 3 members serving one 3-year term with the option to serve a second 3-year term.
 - **Stewards and Finance Team:** 3 members serving one 3-year term with the option to serve a second 3-year term.
 - **Gifts Discernment Team**: 4 members one representative to be chosen from each sub-district, serving one 4-year term.
 - **Program and Arrangements Committee**: 3 members serving one 3-year term, plus the Moderator for the current year.
 - Discipleship and Reconciliation Committee: 4 members serving one 5-year term.

REPORT TO THE DISTRICT CONFERENCE 2020

**Due to the cancelation of the 2020 District Conference and the complexity of communicating the reduction of members in the previously listed teams, the Gifts Discernment Team petitioned the Core Leadership Team for approval of the Slate as presented. The Core Leadership approved the Slate as presented at their September 3, 2020 meeting and sent it as a Recommendation to the District Leadership for approval.

The structure of the District Leadership Team will remain the same, only the number of persons serving on the team mentioned above will be reduced, due to the difficulty of acquiring district members who are willing to participate in the gifts discernment process and serve at the District level.

Approval of the proposed slate by the District Leadership Team would, in essence, enact the proposed motion that was to be presented before the 2020 District Conference. Current team members would serve out their respective terms and the reduction in the number of team members, as mentioned in letter a., would occur over time.

The Gifts Discernment Team also recommends the extension of the Moderator and Moderator Designate terms through 2021 since they were unable to perform their duties at the now canceled 2020 District Conference.

b. AFFIRMATION OF THE SLATE

Recommendation from the Core Leadership Team to approve of Slate of individuals called to serve by the Gifts Discernment Team. **APPROVED 9/12/2020**

**The approved Slate will be listed in the District Conference booklet.

c. <u>AMENDMENT TO THE DISTRICT CONSTITUTION REGARDING CHILDREN, YOUTH AND OUTDOOR MINISTRIES TEAM (CYOM)</u>

The Children, Youth, and Outdoor Ministries Team (CYOM) of the District Leadership Team has not functioned for quite some time. Because of this inaction, the Core Leadership Team Recommends the CYOM Team be dissolved and removed from the District Constitution. Responsibilities related to CYOM

will be assigned to the remaining teams on the District Leadership Team. The funds that have been designated to CYOM are available to use for youth ministries in the District. (See line 62 in the District Treasurer's Report).

APPROVED 9/12/2020

d. PROPOSED DISTRICT BUDGET FOR 2021

The Core Leadership Team recommends the approval of the Proposed 2021 District Budget. **APPROVED 9/12/2020**

**The Proposed District Budget is listed in the District Conference Booklet and the total reflects a \$261.00 decrease.

e. OAKDALE CHURCH OF THE BRETHREN

In light of the Oakdale congregation choosing to close, the Core Leadership Team recommends that the Oakdale COB be officially closed.

APPROVED 9/12/2020


AVAILABLE SPEAKER

Global Mission Prayer Guide



UNITED STATES

Roanoke (La.) Church of the Brethren has asked for **prayers for the Lake Charles area as they recover from Hurricane Laura.** Some 12,000 people remain in shelters and damage is extensive. The roof at the Roanoke church was damaged but repairs will be covered by insurance.

BRAZIL

Pastor Roberto Ferrante from Igreja da Irmandale (Church of the Brethren in Brazil) passed away at the end of August from COVID-19. Ferrante was active in many areas of the Brazilian church and he will be greatly missed. **Pray for Ferrante's family, friends, and congregation during this time.**

SOUTH SUDAN

The Peace Center vehicle was involved in an accident. No one was injured severely but the vehicle will need extensive repairs. **Pray for the work at the Peace Center and that the insurance will cover the repairs of the vehicle.**

MANY OF OUR PARTNERS AND SISTER CHURCHES IN DEVELOPING COUNTRIES

COVID-19 and other restrictions to travel and transportation have caused a dramatic rise in food prices. Pray for our sister congregations and partners as they struggle to feed their families under these conditions.

VENEZUELA

The church in Venezuela has embarked on an evangelism project to indigenous people along the Orinoco River. **Pray for this ongoing Evangelistic Outreach Project.**

PUERTO RICO

Shared by Jeff Boshart: "There was damage to crops from Tropical Storm Isaias. For these farmers, this was a significant loss. Some of them had just started to harvest bananas and plantains that were planted after Hurricane Maria and now they must start again. I don't know how many times they can restart before they give up farming, but then what?" Pray for these farm families as they have difficult decisions in front of them and hurricane season is not over yet.

RWANDA AND THE DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC OF CONGO

As part of the ongoing ministry to the Batwa people, congregations are sponsoring school supplies for the Batwa children. Schools will resume in October but this year funds for the project are lacking. **Pray for the churches as they seek funding to continue this important ministry in education.**


