Together we will continue to share with national leaders in the COB and encourage them to get back on the path of Christ. We will strive to move this culture of permissiveness back to the love and understanding of Jesus our Savior. We together will witness to the communities we live in; that OUR congregations established here in Western Pennsylvania: Believe in Jesus Christ as Savior and the only path to salvation. We believe in The Holy Bible to be

inspired and we try to live a life that reflects Jesus peacefully, simply and together.

So where are you, throwing stones at one another or working side by side to share the truth of Jesus with everyone who needs the light from within to shine through? Satan has to be thrilled when Christians fight and destroy one another. How is it written in Titus 3:9 *"But avoid foolish questions, and genealogies, and contentions, and striving about law; for they are unprofitable and vain"*. Churches are not buildings they are Christians that have the light from within shining through. Be a light for Jesus!

Nevin Dulabaum is a sixth generation Church of the Brethren member who became interested in Brethren heritage in perhaps one of the oddest of ways – through skateboarding! His dad was chaplain at Bridgewater College when Nevin was in his prime skateboarding days. The Alexander Mack library at the college had a great ramp that one could skateboard down and around and end up in front of a big concrete marker on the side of the building that described Alexander Mack as being the founder of the Brethren movement. Nevin remembers looking at that with interest, at the end of many skateboard runs, thinking Germany is far away and that was a long time ago. Fast forward to 1998 when as news director for the General Board Nevin developed an idea to create a CD-Rom resource of Brethren heritage stories and images. His quest to make that resource took him to Brethren heritage sites in Europe three times, as well as a number of sites in the United States. Since 2001, he has presented his "virtual heritage tour" of the places and themes that led to the Brethren movement. He is a professional writer and photographer, and his passion for this topic shows during his presentation. Oh, and since 2008 his day job has been serving as president of Church of the Brethren Benefit Trust/Eder Financial! Registration is free, but required. CEUs are available for \$10.00.
